

BOGOTA, Colombia — Observers predicted today ex-President Laureano Gomez, bolstered by his faction's election showing, will try to block rival Conservative Leon Valencia's presidential candidacy.

It was not shown how such a move would sit with the Liberals, who polled half a million more votes in Sunday's congressional elections than all three conservative factions.

Congress meets July 20 to pick a Conservative president under a Liberal-Conservative truce designed to stop the years of political bloodshed and restore democratic government to this Latin-American republic.
