Plans Discussed For Channeling Defense Contracts

WASHINGTON (AP)—Four state governors and Secretary of Defense McElroy discussed plans for channeling defense contracts into unemployment areas Thursday.

The conference at the White House also dealt with the governors' contentions that National Guard and Reserve units should be maintained at a minimum level of 400,000 men.

Gov. William G. Stratton of Illinois said after the conference that the Defense Department has been talking about fixing the minimum at 360,000.

Stratton declined to provide details as to the outcome of the talk on either Reserve forces or the channeling of defense contracts into unemployment areas.

He said the Defense Department has agreed to present its position more fully at the annual conference of state governors to be held May 18 at Miami, Fla. Stratton was accompanied to the White House by Govs. Albert D. Rosellini of Washington, Edmund S. Muskie of Maine, and Joseph E. Johnson of Vermont.

Adenauer Says Germany Must Accept A-Weapons

BONN, Germany (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer said today that West Germany must equip itself with atomic weapons and permit rocket bases on its soil if NATO considers that necessary for Western defense.

Otherwise, Adenauer told the Socialist opposition, West Germany must get out of the North Atlantic Alliance.

"If we refuse the technical advice of NATO military experts," he declared, "then we are withdrawing from NATO." West Germany cannot withdraw from NATO, he continued, if it is determined to play its part in defending the free world against potential Soviet aggression.



HIS BANK CLOSES

Walter W. Evans, president of the First National Bank of Halfway, Ore., disclosed a shortage of \$100,000 in the bank's funds and announced the bank is closing. Directors voted to liquidate, thus becoming the first insured bank in the nation to be liquidated this year. The teller, Clair Ritter, was arrested.

Teller Of Bank Locked In Jail

PORTLAND (AP)—Clair Ritter, the quiet 32-year-old teller who is accused of embezzling nearly \$100,000 from the First National Bank of Halfway, Ore., was locked in jail here Wednesday.

He was brought here from Baker and bound over to a federal grand jury. Bond was set at \$10,000.

U. S. Commissioner Claire Mundorf, before whom he appeared, advised him he was entitled to the services of an attorney and asked him if he wished to procure one. Ritter, who appeared to be nervous, answered in a low voice that he did not.

The bank has closed but President Walter Evans said the shortage of money would be made up by property Ritter bought over the years and turned over to the bank after the cash shortage was disclosed.

Young Fugitive Gunman Arrested In Chicago

CHICAGO (AP)—A young fugitive gunman, who is wanted in California for a series of crimes last month, including attempted murder, was seized by police last night minutes after he held up a Loop pawn shop.

Two policemen, summoned to the shop by a pedestrian who saw the robbery, overpowered Rhonemus David Rhonemus, 20, as he emerged from the Clark-Lake Pawnshop, at Clark and Lake streets.

The policemen said Rhonemus, who was to have been added to the FBI's 10 Most Wanted list of fugitives today, was carrying a revolver. The FBI had said Rhonemus' motto was "Die young and make a good-looking corpse."

BIG 3, SMALLER CARS

DETROIT (AP)—Burnham Finney, editor of American Machinist, predicts that the auto industry's Big Three soon will be producing small cars to compete with foreign makers. He said the Chevrolet Division of General Motors Corp. has bids out for small-car dies and tools and said he expected Ford and Chrysler to follow.

Home Where Gruesome Murders Occurred Burns

PLAINFIELD, Wis. (AP)—The farmhouse where Edward Gein butchered his murder victims and hid the bodies he looted from graves was destroyed by fire early Thursday.

Vacant since the arrest of Gein, 31-year-old bachelor recluse, last fall, the house had figured recently in a local controversy.

Several area clergymen, among others, had protested plans for an auction of the Gein property on Palm Sunday. Authorities are investigating cause of the blaze.

The fire at the farm, seven miles from here, was spotted from town about 2:30 a.m. but was out of control by the time firemen arrived.

Gein has been committed to Central State Hospital for the criminally insane at Wupun.
