Manslaughter Penalty Handed Man At Albany

ALBANY, Ore. — A sentence of not to exceed six years in prison was meted Bruce Westerberg, 35, Monday for the manslaughter death of Thomas Glenn Phillips, 47.

Westerberg, an unemployed logger of near Stayton, was convicted Friday night of manslaughter, a reduction from the second degree murder charge on which he had been tried.

Westerberg showed no emotion as Circuit Judge Victor Oliver pronounced sentence. Maximum possible sentence would have been 15 years.

Westerberg's attorney, Robert McKechnie, asked the court to be lenient. Dist. Atty. Courtney Johns said Westerberg was fortunate to have gotten off with a manslaughter conviction.

Phillips died in the Westerberg home of a .22 caliber bullet wound Feb. 18 and Westerberg's wife testified that her husband had fired a rifle at the davenport on which Phillips was lying.

In closing the state's case Friday, Johns told the jury that "the nicest thing you can say about this defendant is that he was drunk and didn't know what he was doing."

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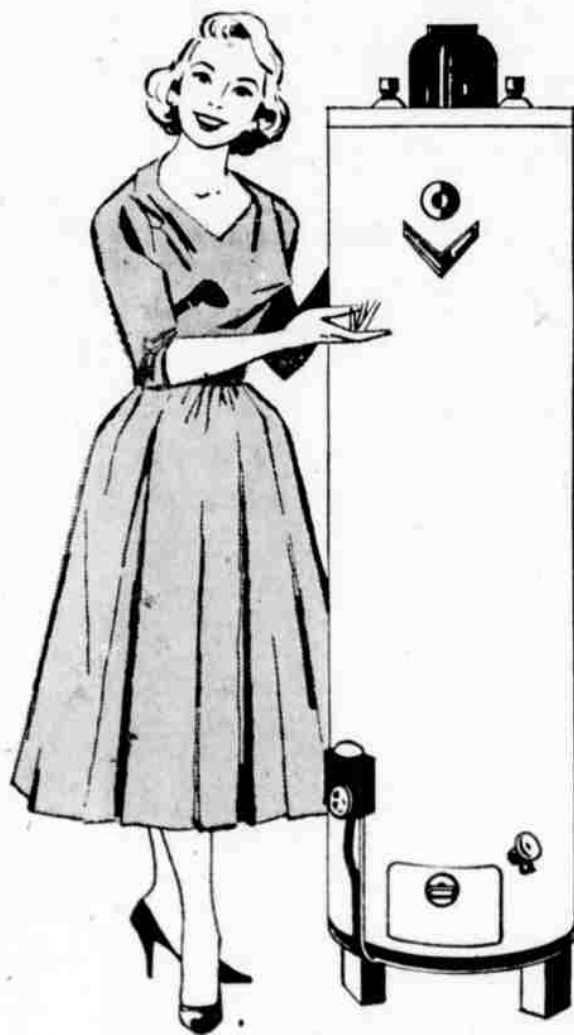
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
