

Sunshine Breaks Out Over Storm Battered California; Floods, Snows Still Severe

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Sunshine broke out over storm-battered California Thursday but thousands remained flooded out of their homes and hundreds snowbound in a train and mountain lodges.

At least four persons died in the most recent of a continuing series of storms that swept over the state Wednesday.

Gov. Goodwin J. Knight declared all of California a disaster area.

An estimated 5,000 were flooded out of their homes, mostly in towns bordering San Francisco Bay.

More than 200 persons were snowbound, trapped in a stalled train in the high Sierras or caught at mountain lodges by snowbound highways.

Highways Closed

Main highways over the high Sierras on the eastern border of California were closed. Motorists were routed northward over state Highway 36 through Susanville.

Rotary snow plows lost, temporarily an incessant battle to keep one lane open.

Southern Pacific's mainline railroad over the mountains was blocked when two snow avalanches trapped a 22 car mail train Wednesday. Its 25 passengers were brought out unhurt.

But SP's streamlined City of San Francisco with 97 persons aboard was stranded in a snowed 15 miles from the slide near Donner Summit, 165 miles northeast of San Francisco.

The "City," enroute from Chicago to Oakland, Calif., was hung up just three miles from where it was snowbound for three days in January, 1952.

Vacationers Stranded

Some 200 motorists and winter vacationers were stranded near — 120 of them at Donner Summit Lodge.

Scores evacuated homes threatened by mudslides in San Francisco and metropolitan Oakland.

With streams running brimful

the state's flood control center reported there was no flooding on major river systems and none in prospect. But many creeks spilled over their banks. Major rivers were cresting below danger points.

A spokesman for Gov. Knight said the disaster proclamation "means that any laws which might slow down the process of bringing swift aid to local authorities unable to cope with their flood situations are now out the window."

The proclamation said the action was taken because "of conditions of extreme peril."

Help Sandbagging

The governor's office said requests for National Guard assistance were confined to heavy equipment to aid in sand bagging.

Drowning victims were William Vallott, 22, whose canoe tipped on wind-whipped Anderson Reservoir near San Jose, and R. J. Chase, 37, who fell into Corte Madera Creek while using a pike pole to clear away debris in Marin County, north of San Francisco.

Claude R. Gallup, 66, Lincoln, Calif., was fatally injured at Roseville near Sacramento when he was hit by a car as he and a fellow worker were trying to set up a road block because of a flooded creek. Clarence Gomes, 27, Sacramento, was crushed between his stalled truck and a car. He was standing behind his truck to signal for help at Quincy near Sacramento when the other car slid across U. S. 40 and hit him.

Loaded Truck Rams Into Train; 8 Persons Hurt

MEDINA, Ohio (AP) — A loaded coal truck ramed into the side of the Baltimore & Ohio's Chicago bound Capital Limited just south of nearby Lodi today, derailing 13 cars and injuring at least eight persons.

The derailed passenger cars remained upright, and the locomotive and first two cars were not derailed, Marshall M. M. Chapman of Lodi said.

At Lodi Hospital, eight persons were brought in and six received emergency treatment and were released. The other two were reported in fair condition.

No names were available.

Marshall Chapman said the loaded coal truck, pulling a loaded trailer, was on a downgrade northbound on Ohio 76 when it struck the locomotive. He said that when he arrived, the truck driver and his helper were walking along the tracks, bleeding severely. He took both to the hospital.

Passengers on the train were removed to another train to continue their westbound trip, Chapman said.

The state highway patrol said the accident happened at 3:30 a.m., at a B & O crossing on Ohio 76 just south of Lodi. The town is about 11 miles southwest of Medina and roughly 30 miles west of Akron.

Boys Selling Soap To Pay Way To Summer Camp

Roseburg area boys between the ages of nine and 15 years are eligible this month to sell soap to help pay their way to the YMCA summer camp at Diamond Lake, Roseburg YMCA Director Wayne Schultz announced today.

Schultz said parents of the boys must sign contracts which state that proceeds of their sons' sales will be turned over to the YMCA to meet all or part of the \$25 per week camp expenses. The soap may be picked up by the prospective salesmen at the old Rose Theater building, 719 SE Cass Ave.

The summer camp will be held in two sessions, July 12-19 and July 20-26.

Schultz said the boys will sell boxes containing four bars of a soap made by a well-known manufacturer. Each box will sell for 60 cents, of which the boy is allowed 25 cents as savings toward attending the camp.

The camp quota is 70 boys each week.

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Douglas Co. Chapter Of OEA Sets Lay Citizen's Banquet

A Douglas County resident will be recognized for outstanding contributions to education in 1957 at Douglas County's chapter of the Oregon Education Assn. chapter's lay citizen banquet April 16.

The event is scheduled to start at 7 p.m. in the Roseburg Elks Club. Mrs. Maxine Smith of Medford, state OEA vice president, will be the guest speaker. Mrs. Smith is a high school teacher at Medford.

Primary purpose of the banquet is to honor the lay citizen in education, but retiring teachers from throughout the county will also be recognized, according to Mrs. Harold S. Mathewman, third grade instructor at Riverside School, vice president of the county OEA and program chairman for the banquet.

Name Kept Secret

Name of the person to be named lay citizen of 1958 will not be revealed until the night of the banquet. The person will be presented a plaque.

The person selected for the title will not be professionally connected with education. The person named might be active in school legislation, PTA activities or development of teaching aids, Mrs. Mathewman said.

Teachers throughout the county submit names and qualifications of persons to a county OEA committee. The committee screens the applicants and selects a person for the honor.

Music for the event will be furnished by Glade High School students under the direction of John C. Bigelow, instrumental music instructor, and Lyman Pruitt, vocal music instructor.

Queen Hands Out Coins, Instead Of Washing Feet

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II handed out silver coins to 64 aged men and women Thursday instead of washing their feet.

It was part of the Maundy Thursday ceremony — an ancient ritual by which Britain marks the coming of Easter.

Queen Elizabeth I was the last queen to perform Britain's ancient rite of foot-washing the citizenry on the Thursday before Easter although some kings performed it later. In the middle of the 18th century, the practice was abandoned.

At 11:32 a.m., two minutes late, Queen Elizabeth II arrived before Westminster Abbey with her husband, Prince Philip. A crowd of about 10,000 politely applauded.

Accompanied by the Lord High Almoner, the Bishop of St. Albans, Dr. Michael Jones, the royal couple walked to their seats in the same abbey where Elizabeth was crowned.

A yeoman — with a silver dish on his head — marched up with the purses of coins specially minted for the Maundy handout.

The queen gave a green purse containing one pound 15 shillings (\$4.90) to 32 women and a white purse holding two pounds 5 shillings (\$6.30) to 32 men.

In olden days the kings and queens washed the feet of "as many persons as the sovereign has years." Thursday, there is specially minted money to represent the queen's years.
