Pinball Operators Can Continue, But Must List Devices

HILLSBORO — Pinball operators in Washington County can continue their games for the present, but will have to tell how many machines they have and where they are.

That was the effect of a ruling Monday by Circuit Judge Glen Hieber, who turned down the district attorney's office request for sharper restrictions.

Four pinball machine operators had earlier obtained a temporary restraining order blocking officials from confiscating the pinball machines as gambling devices. Monday the court heard arguments from Dist. Atty. Francis Linklater who asked that while the restraining order was in effect, operators be required to post bond of \$500 on each machine and make an accounting of revenues.

An April 22 hearing on making the restraining permanent was canceled. Judge Hieber said he would reschedule it after the state takes steps to bring the whole question to issue.

Pinball machines which pay off with free games were held by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton recently to be gambling devices.

The court hearings followed, as operators sought to block seizure of the machines.

Mickey Cohen Convicted On One Battery Charge

LOS ANGELES — Mickey Cohen, convicted on one battery charge, now faces another.

The cocky little ex-gambler was found guilty of battery and disturbing the peace Monday. A waiter, Arthur M. Black, 30, complained that Mickey socked him last Jan. 29 at the Villa Capri restaurant.

A federal charge of felonious assault, to be heard April 18, was filed against Cohen after he showed up at the office of Howard Chappell head of the U.S. narcotics bureau here, last March 27. Cohen claimed federal agents were trying to frame him on a dope charge. Chappell denied this.

Foreign Ministers Slate Meeting In Seattle Oct. 20

SEATTLE — Foreign ministers and delegates from 15 south-east Asia and Pacific Rim nations will meet here Oct. 20 to open the 10th annual Colombo Conference.

Announcement of the site by the State Department Monday climaxed weeks of maneuvering by Seattle, San Francisco and other cities seeking the sessions.

At Olympia, Gov. Rosellini expressed pleasure over the selection of Seattle and promised united effort by state and city officials to insure the success of the 26-day meeting.

"The state and Seattle comprise the newest frontier of the United States," the governor said, "and our well qualified to demonstrate to older friends of the Pacific Rim the hospitality so necessary for a major international conference of this kind."

Originally organized by the British Commonwealth of Nations, the conference is held annually to discuss and plan economic and development in the Far Eastern area. Approximately 200 delegates and as many observers are expected to attend.

Vice President Nixon may open the conference, officials said, and it is expected that Secretary of State Dulles will attend at least part of the meeting.

The two dead, picked up by a Japanese cargo boat shortly after the crash, were Donald R. Nielsen, parachute rigger, I.C., San Diego, Calif., and Robert J. Bartowski, aviation electrician's mate J.C., Newburgh Heights, Ohio.

The trees will be presented Thursday on behalf of the U.S. capital by American Ambassador Douglas MacArthur II.

They will be planted near the Japanese Diet (Parliament) building in Tokyo, around the site of a memorial planned for Yukio Ozaki. As mayor of Tokyo in 1909, he presented the 1,000 cherry trees which have become one of Washington's most beautiful sights.
