

Steelhead, Spring Chinook Runs Remain About Normal

Migration of winter steelhead and spring chinook salmon in the North Umpqua River was about normal during the period through March 31. The twice-monthly report from the regional office of the Oregon

State Game Commission at Roseburg shows both runs of fish to have picked up satisfactorily after a slow start. Comparative figures are reported as follows:

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Bowling Alley Building Razed By \$250,000 Fire

YAKIMA (AP) — Fire destroyed the Skookum Bowling Alley building Monday with an estimated loss of \$250,000.

The 10-lane bowling alley, a fountain lunch, barber shop and an office equipment company were destroyed. The fire apparently started in the basement of the wood-domed building of an unknown cause.

Co-owner Carrol H. Russell said there was about \$50,000 dollars insurance on the building and about \$30,000 on the bowling alley. He indicated all the businesses were insured, but not sufficiently to cover the loss.

Shutdowns Announced By 2 Assembly Plants

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Shutdown schedules and layoffs were announced by two auto assembly plants in the San Francisco Bay area Tuesday.

General Motors said Chevrolet passenger car and Fisher Body plants in Oakland will close down April 21 through April 23, affecting about 1,085 employees. Out of line dealer inventories was the reason given.

Ford said its assembly plant at Milpitas, which closed Friday for a week, will shut down for another week April 18. The plant will start laying off about 400 of its 1,900 workers because of reduced sales, the firm said.
