County Welfare Workers Will Attend Session

Five County Welfare Department workers and a juvenile department counselor will attend the Northwest Regional Child Welfare League Conference in Seattle Sunday through Tuesday.

Persons attending the conference will be Mrs. Lois Baker, county welfare administrator; Miss Helen Falber, welfare public assistant supervisor; Mrs. Mildred Hayes and Dan Gillon, case workers; and Mrs. Lee Carstensen, Juvenile Department counselor.

Keynote speaker at the conference will be Father Swithum Bowers, director of the school of social work at the University of Ottawa, Washington Gov. Albert D. Rosellini will address the conference on "Child Welfare as Seen From the Executive Mansion."

Other on the agenda will include Annie Lee Sandusty of the Children's Bureau at Washington, D. C., and Mrs. Gordon Hamilton, author of books on social work.

Persons attending the conference will be from eight western states and Canada.

Americans Beaten In Cuban Revolt

MIAMI, Fla. — Travelers who saw violence erupt in Wednesday's abortive rebel coup told of rough treatment and close calls.

Two U. S. newsmen reported they were beaten by government police and soldiers.

Neal Wilkinson, 37, a correspondent for the New York Daily News, said in Miami he was beaten on the arms and back by a national policeman with a "thing like a carriage whip," as he stood watching the police break up a group of youths who were chanting "Fidel, Fidel," rebel chieftain Castro's first name on the Prado.

Wilkinson said the policeman beat him until he fled into his nearby hotel.

Bernard Brennan, 30, Moodus, Conn., a free-lance writer, said soldiers banged him with a gun butt and destroyed some of his film as he shot pictures of a machine-gun squad spraying an alley where they were trying to flush out rebels.

Mike Manheim, Greensboro, N.C., who stayed at the Havana Hilton Hotel, said telephone service went off after a series of explosions Wednesday. Manheim said a policeman was driving pedestrians to cover with a bull whip.

House Fire Kills Five Children

CLEVELAND — A flash fire swept through a 2½-story frame house Thursday and killed five children, all under 8 years of age.

Their mother, who was preparing breakfast, escaped with her 2-year-old daughter and stood in a driveway screaming. Neighbors tried to save the children, but the flames blocked off the rescue attempts. Efforts to persuade the children to jump from a second-floor bedroom window failed.

Killed were these children of Arthur Hicks, 30, and his wife, Ann, 24: Richard, 7, Robert, 6, Barbara, 5, Roger, 4, and Ronald, 4 months. Mrs. Hicks and the baby girl were burned slightly.

"I was in the kitchen when I heard a thud," Mrs. Hicks said.

Man Dies, Others Hurt In Traffic Collision

PORTLAND — Two automobiles collided at an intersection here Wednesday and one smashed into a parked car.

James L. Waldt, 72, of Portland, suffered fatal injuries in the crash. His wife, Mrs. Belinda Waldt, 70, suffered head cuts.

Two persons in the other car—Ray O. Shults, 30, and his 3-year-old nephew, Duane Shults, also were hurt.

Waldt was Oregon's 13th traffic fatality this month and the 96th this year in the Associated Press tabulation.

Convicted Killer Marries Girl, 23

NEW BRUNSWICK, N.J. — A convicted wife killer married his 23-year-old sweetheart in county jail here yesterday.

An hour after the ceremony, Richard Larry Hunt was taken to Trenton State Prison to begin serving a life sentence for the murder of his first wife. Hunt, 28, won't be eligible for parole until 1971.

He and Joanne Campbell, both of Baltimore, exchanged vows while a guard and a member of the sheriff's staff served as witnesses. The Rev. Robert B. Miguera of the New Brunswick Bible Church officiated.

Hunt was dressed in the black suit and tie that his bride brought for him. It was the same suit he wore Tuesday, when Judge Klemmer Katterhausen pronounced the life sentence.

Joanne wore a full-length white wedding gown. Both smiled happily after the simple ceremony.

Then they spent an hour alone in the jail's visiting room, where a wire mesh screen separated man and wife.

Jackson Co. Bars Pinball Seizures

Jackson County law enforcement officers are barred from seizing pinball machines by a court order signed Wednesday by Jackson County Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna.

Pinball machine operators asked for the order after Jackson County officials said they intended to move against the pinball machines. This stemmed from a recent ruling by Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton that the machines are gambling devices if they pay off in free games.

Circuit court judges have signed similar orders to keep police from seizing the machines — in Wasco, Washington and Polk counties.

There will be a hearing on the same request in Klamath County on April 28.
