TULSA, Okla. (AP) — A busy week is ahead for Russian wrestlers due here Wednesday to prepare for three matches against an all-star American squad.

While in the state the Soviet grapplers will meet Gov. Raymond Gary; receive the keys to Tulsa from Mayor George E. Norvell; see their first baseball game, as the world champion Milwaukee Braves meet the Detroit Tigers in a Thursday exhibition game, and visit the Will Rogers memorial in Claremore.

The group, composed of eight of the country's best wrestlers and leader Mike Peslyak, will be accompanied by U.S. State Department interpreter Alexia Malyshev.

The American team, coached by Clay Roberts of the Tulsa YMCA, includes top competitors at last week's AAU championships in San Francisco.

Pineau Say Good Offices Failed To Reconcile Views

PARIS (AP) — Foreign Minister Christian Pineau said Thursday the British-American good offices team has failed to reconcile French and Tunisian views on control of the Tunisian-Algerian border.

This is the most stubborn issue of all between France and Tunisia. Inability to settle it probably would mean failure of the mediation efforts which U.S. Undersecretary of State Robert Murphy and British diplomat Harold Bealey undertook seven weeks ago.

The good offices team is expected to announce soon that it has been unable to get the two countries together for direct talks. France and Tunisia then might press complaints against each other before the U.N. Security Council.

Pineau gave the Foreign Affairs Committee of the French National Assembly a summary of the Murphy-Bealey negotiations. The meeting was closed but deputies present gave a broad outline of his remarks.

Pineau also ruled out any good offices mission by U.N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld if Murphy and Bealey give up.

The French cabinet interrupts its Easter vacation Friday, on the call of Premier Felix Gaillard, for an emergency meeting to discuss the deadlock.

France claims rebels fighting French rule in Algeria use neighboring Tunisia, a former French protectorate, as a base. France insists on a rigid border patrol and other measures to halt Algerian rebel activities in Tunisia.

Jet Bombers Slate Trip To England Shortly

SPOKANE (AP) — Several big B52 jet bombers from Fairchild Air Force Base will fly to England within a few days for a routine training exercise, the Air Force announced this week.

It's a 5,338-mile trip and the bombers could make it nonstop without refueling, but the announcement gave no details on whether a nonstop flight is planned.

Col. D. E. Hillman, commander of the 92nd bomb wing at Fairchild, said only that several B52s would make the trip and declined to disclose the specific number.

The B52 is a prime atom bomb carrier of the Strategic Air Command. Col. Hillman said the bombers from Spokane would be in England for only a short period. He didn't say how long.
