Commission Considering Bridge Bid Withdrawal

SALEM — State highway officials met here Friday to consider the possibility that a firm may withdraw from a contract to build twin bridges over the Snake River.

Highway Engineer W. C. Williams said the Hoffman Construction Co. of Portland indicated it may withdraw from the \$720,000 contract for building the twin 968-foot-long bridges over the Snake near Ontario.

The company indicated its bid was too low, Williams said. If the firm does withdraw, its \$36,000 bidder's bond would be forfeited, Williams said.

"We are looking at the possibility of withdrawing. We will reach a decision in the next couple of days," W. Burns Hoffman, the firm's president, said in Portland.

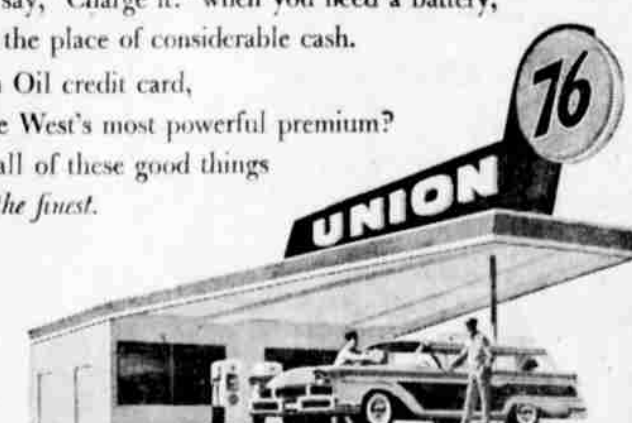
