DAHLIAS

Dahlia, in a flash of wonderful forms and colors, can give your garden lots of pep this summer. If you know how they are easy to grow — from exhibition dahlias in dinner plates down to 2-inch pompoms.

But don't be in a hurry to plant them. They should be planted around May 1. However, after a mild winter such as we have had, the middle of April is not too soon. It is easy to be impatient when Spring comes, but don't plant right after the last frost. Dahlias planted too early mature in hot weather and produce poor flowers.

Dahlias are not fussy about soil, provided it is deeply cultivated, well-drained and rich in humus. They also need full sun. Compost or other humus should be dug into the dahlia bed every year. Cultivate the surface soil until plants are about a foot high. After that, feeder roots are near the surface and likely to be damaged by cultivation.

Use mulch the rest of the season to keep down weeds and conserve moisture. If the soil is too rich more failures occur than in too-poor soil. In the bottom of the hole where each tuber will be planted, work a tablespoonful of bone meal, and some sand in the soil. When the plants are about 5 inches high, work a small handful of balanced plant food into the top inch of soil in a ring a foot or more out from the stalk. This will be enough if the soil is rich. Don't use high-nitrogen plant foods or stems will be come soft and plants will grow leaves at the expense of flowers. Plant the bulbs 6 inches deep (a little deeper if soil is light; and slightly less if larger is small and soil heavy.) Cover with 2 inches of soil. Dahlias of large varieties need at least three feet between plants, smaller ones can be placed one to two feet apart.

To top and disbud plants, pinch out the tops of Dahlia plants after the second set of leaves have developed. This forces the plant branch to form four flower stalks instead of one. If you want huge, exhibition type of blooms, leave the tip but go down the stem removing side buds, except for the two bottom ones which are needed to produce large exhibition type flowers. Only large varieties need at least three feet between plants, smaller ones can be placed one to two feet apart.

Farm Facts

Over a period of years farmers have learned that crop land and pasture land will not grow continuous good crops or feed for stock forever, without putting something back into the land in the way of improvements. Fertilizing, cultivating, mulching and the growing of certain "green manure" crops all help to retain or build up the produced fertility of cropland. Pastures also need rejuvenating by some of the same methods and by rotating the stock so that areas are not damaged by over grazing.

Intelligent people have come to realize that, although nature has provided abundant resources for our use, development, we must put something back into the "pot" if we are to continue to get the maximum use from them. With mineral resources, ores are mined never to be replaced, but with "living" resources, this need not be the case. With proper management, we can keep the latter growing continuously.

Probably the best example of our "living" resources is timber. Nature grew it, and we are in a position to help her to keep growing it. Timber is not only a resource, it is also a crop and should be grown as such, not mined like minerals.

FORTUNATELY, we have a number of people who have seen the light and are managing their timber as a crop. As always, however, there are those who continue to take without giving.

Petches, you have heard people say, "I'm too old to plant trees, or prune and thin them. I'll be dead before these things will do me any good. Let someone else do this work, someone younger."

Apparently it never occurred to these individuals that if someone in the past hadn't looked ahead and done a little unselfish planning as well as we are today. If our forefathers hadn't made some provisions for the future in the way of setting up a stable government, creating new inventions and making other improvements, we'd still be living in a very primitive way.

IT'S LIKE THIS with timber. If we don't provide for the future, the future may not hold much in store for succeeding generations. There are few people who would intentionally deprive future generations. And yet, there are quite a number who would do it unintentionally.

If you have unproductive cutover land, plan to reforest at least part of it this coming fall. If you're planning to harvest timber this year, consider methods which will stimulate natural reseedling or plan to reforest. If you have young growing timber, inquire about pruning and thinning, which will improve the quality and growth rate of your trees.

Providing for the future is a chain reaction if everyone does his job, with succeeding generations benefiting. Don't break the chain.

More Graduates Forestry's Need, Executive Says

BEND (AP) — Forestry needs creative graduate students rather than more pupils on the vocational level, the president of the Society of American Foresters says.

Forest management and conservation is an art that is changing rapidly, Dr. George Garratt told a regional meeting of the society.

To meet the changing times, he said, more creative graduate students must be obtained to shape future practices.

"The future of forestry will be molded not by the foresters of the present—but by students not yet in school," said Garratt, dean of the Yale University School of Forestry.

Garratt gave the keynote speech at the society's Columbia Section ended a two-day conference here Saturday. Nearly 400 members attended.

Forestry concepts also must be changed, said Edward Woolzley, to meet the demands of a mushrooming population in the United States.

Woolzley is director of the Bureau of Land Management in Portland.
