

Congress Told Uncle Sam Should Spend \$65 Million Annually To Help Indians

WASHINGTON — Congress has been told that Uncle Sam should plan to spend about 65 million dollars annually to improve the health of American Indians.

Shaw said "intensive efforts are needed in the area of maternal and child health" to increase the life span of the Indian. "We know that it will ultimately cost \$65 million dollars a year to operate a reasonably adequate program to meet the need for improving health," Shaw said.

"Inadequate health services explain in part the present depressed condition of Indian health. Although the federal government began to provide health services for Indians in the early 19th century, these services never have been wholly adequate.
