A search party came upon them Monday afternoon. They were wet — rain had come down most of the time — but "We never were really lost," said Pat Kelly, 17, their leader.

"We knew which way and where we had to go," he said. "Our problem was just getting there."

By error, the six had been let out of a car Saturday, six miles from where the boys thought they were going to be let out to start a hike. With that information, search groups Monday concentrated on trails down which it was regarded as certain the boys eventually would pass.

A plane at mid-afternoon spotted them in a clearing beside Siouxi Creek and a ground party soon reached them.

The boys said they took turns at night sleeping in the single two-man mountain tent they carried. They kept their matches dry and had fire and food.

Ohio Woman Lives With Transplanted Kidney From Child

BOSTON (AP) — An Ohio woman without a kidney of her own has been kept alive for five weeks at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital with a kidney transplanted from an unrelated 4-year-old child.

This transplant is the first of its kind in medical history. Kidneys have been transplanted successfully between identical twins but never before between unrelated persons. The obstacle was the tendency of the recipient's body to reject the transplanted tissue.

But in the case of Mrs. Gladys Lowman, 31, Franklin, Ohio, kidney function has gradually increased though it is too early to predict success. A hospital announcement said Mrs. Lowman's condition remains critical.

"This is the first instance in which such a complex procedure has been attempted and it is much too early to evaluate it in terms of future treatment of kidney failure," a hospital report said. Nevertheless, the report added: "The rejection of tissues between unrelated persons . . . if overcome, could mean a new era in medical science."

Mrs. Lowman was born with only a single kidney. She became critically ill in mid-March when hemorrhage developed in the single kidney. To save her life the kidney was removed. She was flown to Boston and placed under treatment with the Peter Bent Brigham artificial kidney while more than 45 doctors and five Boston medical institutions pooled the knowledge that resulted in the unrelated transplant.

Second Boy Dies After Gunfight

DANA POINT, Calif. (AP) — Fourteen-year-old Charles Allyn Seyfert died Tuesday night in a hospital, the fourth victim of a gunfight in which his father, younger brother and a deputy sheriff were killed.

Charles was wounded when he joined his brother Tommy, 19, and his father Charles Seyfert, 39, of Tucson, Ariz., in the battle with two sheriff's deputies Monday night.

Police said Charles fired the shots that killed Deputy Robert L. Schultz, 37. Deputy Edward Gene Johnson, also wounded, was reported improving today after surgery.

Charles was shot by Schultz as he fell wounded.

An autopsy disclosed that the father and Tommy died of 22-caliber bullet wounds, the deputies' guns were .38 caliber.

"This almost impossible situation demonstrates again that the Board of Control should be abolished," Holmes said.

Youthful Slayer Given 32 Years

REXBURG, Idaho (AP) — Troubled Tommy Brophy, 15, a poetry-writing youth who had 20 neighbors marked for murder, sat in a cell today awaiting perhaps the security he has never known.

The high school sophomore was given 32 years in prison Monday for killing his mother last February. He must serve at least a third of it.

"It is difficult to understand you," said Judge Willard Burton

as Tommy wept quietly during the sentencing. "You are a quiet nice-appearing boy, but beneath the surface there is a storm raging. . . . You have become a menace to society, and this society which you have not trusted cannot trust you."

Tommy twice blasted Mrs. Nellie Mae Hinckley, 36, with a shotgun, then fired a rifle bullet into her head. He was convicted of second-degree murder despite his plea of temporary insanity.

NEW YORK (AP) — The Eugene, Ore., Register-Guard was named Wednesday as winner of second place in its class in the annual safe driving campaign for newspaper vehicles.

The awards were announced at the annual convention of the American Newspaper Publishers Assn. The Register-Guard competed in Group B (circulation 201,001 to 50,000) of the private motor carrier division. First place was taken by the Alexandria, La., Town Talk.

The Boise, Idaho, Statesman received a certificate of merit. The 307 newspapers participating in the different classes operated 7,288 vehicles 175,743,758 miles at a rate of 1.83 accidents per 100,000 miles. One accident was fatal.
