Civil Air Patrol Under Criticism In Plane Search

SALEM — Charges that the Civil Air Patrol hindered the search for the crashed plane of Fresno airman Bruce Davis near Dayville last week were made Monday by Earl W. Snyder, state director of aeronautics.

Snyder said, "The CAP at times hindered search efforts through indiscriminate broadcasting of rumors as facts. Their conduct bordered on the criminal."

"Once, CAP radioed the mission was completed when in fact an Air Force helicopter had only arrived at the scene of operation. Rescue personnel were further troubled when CAP falsely broadcast that another aircraft had crashed."

"This was the role CAP played while volunteer pilots of the state Aeronautics Board's search and rescue organization were risking their necks, and while volunteer farmers and townspeople formed a ground party."

Davis spent three days walking to a ranch house for help, while his wife remained near the crashed plane. She then was picked up by the Air Force helicopter.

Snyder said he was shocked when the CAP got credit for the rescue.

YMCA Youth Legislature Passes Narcotics Bill

SALEM — Legislation to provide stiffer punishment for narcotics pushers easily sailed through the YMCA Youth Legislature meeting in the state capitol here last weekend.

Some 300 high school juniors and seniors are taking part in the 11th annual YMCA legislative session which concludes Saturday evening.

The bill on narcotics pushers, which called for life imprisonment after a second conviction, was the first bill to go through both houses.

Bills calling for abolition of capital punishment, tax deduction for higher education expenses and new rules for vehicles entering highways passed in the Senate.

A total of 61 bills were submitted for consideration.

Proposal To Hold Rates Hearing In NW Vetted

WASHINGTON — Proposals that regional hearings on the latest railroad freight rate increases be held in the Pacific Northwest have been turned down.

The Interstate Commerce Commission announced the refusal here and said the next public hearings will be here May 12, May 19 and July 21. The Oregon and Washington state utility commissions and shipping interests in the area asked the regional sessions.

The increases, averaging 2 percent on most items, were granted in February, subject to later investigation and possible refunds.
