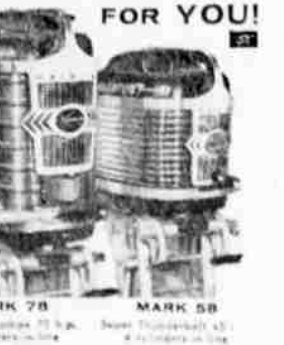
Military Pay Raise Assured
