Effort To Draft Former Governor For Idaho Told

BOISE — An effort to draft Len B. Jordan, former governor, as an opponent of Gov. Robert E. Smylie for the Republican nomination for governor was reported in progress Wednesday.

Jordan, who recently purchased an interest in the famed Circle C Ranch at New Meadows, was at the ranch and unavailable immediately for comment.

John Corlett, veteran political writer for the Idaho Statesman, reported what he termed "another effort" to get Jordan to run against Smylie.

"Several Magic Valley Republicans, long identified with the so-called Jordan faction and who are anti-Smylie, have called a meeting for next Monday evening in Twin Falls to urge Jordan to seek the governorship nomination," Corlett wrote.

"Since last fall these Republicans have urged Jordan to run but he has said he did not desire to get into politics to that extent in 1958. He did not close the door to 1960 when the Senate seat of Henry C. Dworshak (R-Idaho) will be at stake."

Mr. and Mrs. Carl Downing of Stella Street are the parents of a new baby daughter, their third, born April 29. The Downings are new residents of the Green area.

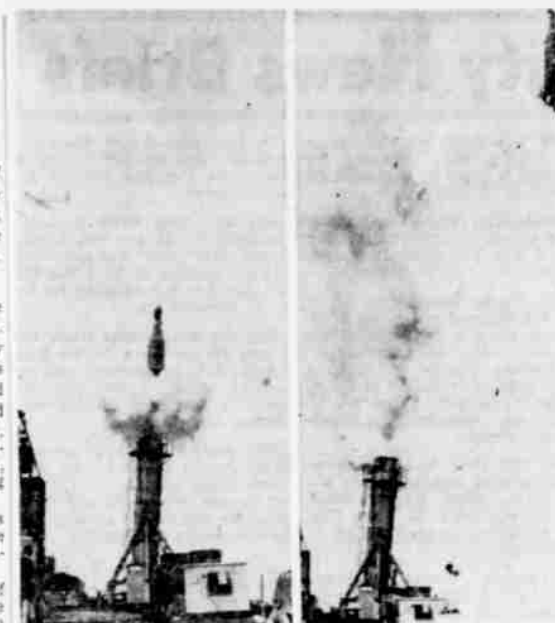
Attend Eugene Service

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Meat Animals Withheld From Market; Price Up

PORTLAND — Current high meat prices are caused by livestock producers withholding meat animals from market, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Marketing Service said Wednesday.

Supplies of slaughter animals are falling, but consumer demand has weakened only a little, the marketing service said.

Prices of meat in late winter approached, but did not reach, previous record highs. The Marketing Service said beef prices will probably be moderately lower this summer.

Boycotts of retail red meats were attempted recently by groups of housewives in Eugene and Portland in an attempt to lower prices. No noticeable effect was reported.

Washington Cracks Down On 'Fish Hogs'

SEATTLE — A crackdown on "fish hogs" was ordered Wednesday by John Biggs, director of the State Game Department.

An unduly large number of Washington anglers are displaying very little respect for the state game laws," Biggs said, noting that 115 violators were caught Sunday at one road check in Central Washington.

The legal daily limit on trout is 15 fish or 7½ pounds plus one fish.

This is the finest fishing season in the state's history, Biggs said, adding:

"It is my intention to end this trend toward fish and game law violations."

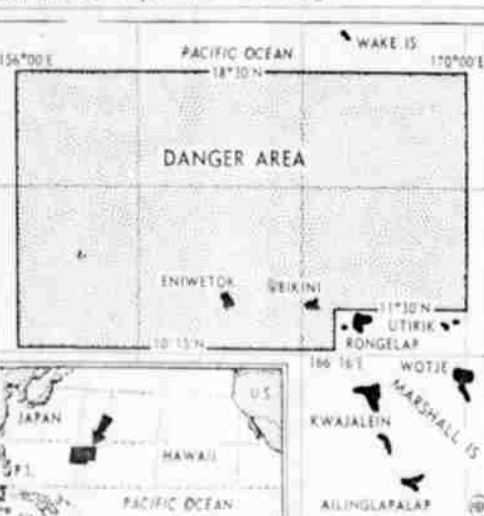
PLAN TRIP

The AEC recently issued regulations barring U.S. citizens from the area—except specifically at members of a pacifist group who plan to sail a 30-foot ketch, "The Golden Rule," into the atomic zone as a protest against the tests.

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
