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Hitchcock Says Norblad Getting Aid From GOP

PORTLAND — Phil Hitchcock, seeking the TOP nomination as congressman from Oregon's 1st District, said the national Republican organization is giving aid to Rep. Walter Norblad, his opponent.

He said Norblad plans to campaign with a film prepared by the GOP congressional campaign committee.

"The national Republican Party," said Hitchcock, "still seems to be telling us peasants here in Oregon how to run our political business and whom we must nominate in our primaries." This was in apparent reference to the charge he and his supporters made two years ago when his U.S. Senate primary opponent, Doug McKay, got endorsement from President Eisenhower.

Hitchcock added that so far this year, Norblad has used the equal of \$10,000 in free government postage in mailings to voters in the district.

Some Luxuries Cut Out Of Department Budget

WASHINGTON — Congressional pressure has forced the State Department to cut out plans for cabanas, beach huts, mountain retreats and cabin boats for U. S. diplomats at scattered points around the world.

But the department still intends to build swimming pools in Tehran, Port-au-Prince and Seoul for the recreation of the Foreign Service officers and their families.

These glimpses of the State Department budget were offered in close-session testimony before a House Appropriations subcommittee last January and February.

Laid-Off Plywood Crew Pickets Plant

COQUILLE — Coquille Plywood's plant here was picketed Monday by men laid off at the company's Bandon operation. Most of the 370 men here respected the picket line.

The pickets said that when laid off they were told they would have preference in hiring here. Some 40 men have been hired locally, they said, without reference to their preferred status.

The Plywood and Sawmill Workers Union said it had proposed a federal mediator be called.

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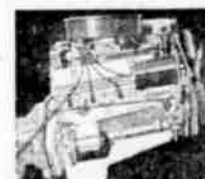
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
