

Sen. Jackson Says America Can't Purchase Affection

VICTORIA, B.C. — A United States senator says many Americans are "so materialistic they think they can buy the affection of a poor country by spending a lot of money in it."

Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.) told the 13th annual Olympic Longing Conference here Friday that such thinking is "the greatest mistake we have made in our foreign policy."

"We have no right to go into a strange country and demand they adopt our way of life," he said. "We should aim at keeping them free and independent so that they have the right to live according to their own ideas."

Sen. Jackson, a member of the U.S. Joint Committee on Atomic Energy and a visitor to Russia in 1956, keynoted the two-day conference.

Warning against U.S. "smugness," he declared: "If the Russian sputnik did nothing else, it made us more humble, more conscious of our deficiencies. We were suffering from a national superiority complex."

He told of a rapid Russian advance in science and culture. "In the Soviet Union today there are about 12 million Russians studying the English language, but no more than 10,000 Americans are learning Russian."

"The Russians are studying 43 different languages right down to the dialects of small villages in Africa and Asia. That means they could if the occasion warranted, walk into these places and talk to people in their own language."

"You know what that means in terms of local influence."

Sen. Jackson said there is only one U.S. ambassador behind the Iron curtain who can speak the local language.

He also said the Russians now have 300 operational submarines and many of them are active "up and down our coasts."

"We know they are making reports and pin-pointing the spots where they could launch missiles in the event of a war. We have only about five subs that can launch missiles," he added.

Hatfield Campaign Bad For GOP, Unander Says

PORTLAND — Sig Unander declared Monday that the campaign of Mark Hatfield, one of the Republican opponents for the nomination for governor, is injuring the party.

Speaking at a meeting of women volunteers at his headquarters here, Unander said that Hatfield had referred to a forest roads program offered by Unander as "glib promises and verbal garbage."

"Personal attacks by the secretary of state in his quest for political adventure are weakening the Republican Party," Unander said of Hatfield.

Unander said his access road program suggestion for a self-liquidating fund modeled on the St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corp. was sound and was being viewed favorably by both Republican and Democratic congressmen.

Alleged 11-Time Slayer Standing Trial For Murder

LINCOLN, Neb. — Bantam killer Charles R. Starkweather, after three months in the isolation of a prison cell, will be ushered today into a district courtroom to stand trial for murder.

The 3-foot-5 redhead, who once acknowledged he had "always wanted to be a criminal, but not this big a one," is charged with first-degree murder in one of 11 slayings he had admitted.

Selection of a jury will set the proceedings in motion. This task may take three days or more.

Conviction would bring a sentence of life imprisonment or death in the electric chair. The jury sets the penalty under Nebraska law.

Insanity apparently will be the defense plea, although court-appointed defense attorneys have run into reluctance not only from the 19-year-old defendant but from family members as well on this score.

Starkweather's 14-year-old girl friend, Carol Ann Fugate, charged with murder as companion to Starkweather on his January killing spree, has been listed as a prosecution witness, although she may not necessarily be called.

Both Starkweather and Carol are charged specifically in the death of Robert Jensen, 17, of Benet, a village 19 miles southeast of Lincoln.

Old Deck Hanger Used For Tests

CHINA LAKE, Calif. — The Navy says it has saved the taxpayers a half million dollars by making a high altitude chamber out of an old deck hanger from a submarine.

The bulky hanger weighs 32 tons. It was brought from the Philadelphia Navy Yard to the Naval Ordnance Test Station here by way of the Panama Canal.

"The thing," as the Navy calls it, is only costing \$50,000 to bring the sub hanger on the transport submarine Sea-lion as a deck hanger for housing a landing boat and amphibious equipment.

Here it will be used to test pyrotechnics and explosives after it is converted to a high altitude test chamber.

The hanger is 35 feet long and weighs 17 tons. The Navy said it would have cost \$550,000 to build the needed high altitude test chamber. But it is only costing \$50,000 to bring the sub hanger here, modify and equip it.
