

Geddes Tells Lane Rally Republicans Have Chance

At a Republican rally at the Lane County fairgrounds Wednesday night, Paul E. Geddes, GOP candidate for Congress, declared that prospects were excellent for many Republican candidates to receive Democratic support in the general election.

He maintained that many Oregon Democrats resent what he termed "domination of their party by a small clique of hard-shelled, centered politicians" who, he said, are dictating party policy and "giving the back of their hands to members of their own party who don't agree with them."

Supreme Court Candidate Makes Visit To Roseburg

Samuel M. Bowe, Grants Pass attorney who is running for Position 3 of the Oregon Supreme Court carried his campaign to Douglas County Wednesday.

The 48-year-old candidate visited communities in the southern part of the county and then made the rounds in Roseburg. His schedule calls for him to work his way north to Salem and then down the coast.

Commenting on the heavy backlog of cases in the high court, Bowe said, "I feel it is going to be necessary for every justice who is going to serve to really dedicate himself to increasing the individual work load until the backlog is caught up. One of the ways I believe it can be done is to shorten the length of the individual opinions, particularly when a case does not involve any new points of law."

Douglas County members of his statewide committee are Spencer W. Yates and James G. Richmond, Roseburg attorneys.

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Britain Has Concluded Pacific Nuclear Tests

LONDON — Britain announced today she has concluded her latest nuclear weapon tests in the Christmas Island area of the Pacific.

A Foreign Office spokesman said all interested countries had been notified that the area no longer is dangerous to shipping.

Shipping was warned off the area April 23. Three days later a nuclear device was tested, the fifth nuclear weapon Britain has fired in the Pacific since test headquarters were set up on Christmas Island more than a year ago.

The government said the fallout from the latest explosion was negligible but it gave no details of the device.
