

Passengers Screech When Alligator Gets Loose

PARIS — Passengers screeched when an alligator waded down the aisle of an Air France plane during a stopover at Nîmes in French West Africa Tuesday.

The airport crew quickly got nets and captured it, Hermann Broker, a German business executive, said he had the 'gator—about 2½ feet long and three months old—in a leather pouch on his lap. He dozed off and his pet wiggled free.

Broker was advised to keep closer watch over the 'gator for the rest of the flight to Paris.

GANG MILL PLANNED

PORTLAND — A \$300,000 gang mill will be built at Toledo, Ore., by Georgia-Pacific Lumber Corp., Robert Pamplin, company president, said Wednesday.

The mill will employ 28 men per shift and produce 80,000 board feet a day.

Construction will begin May 15, and the mill is scheduled for operation by next Jan. 1.

Southern Oregon Art Exhibit Set At Grants Pass

The eleventh annual Southern Oregon Art Exhibit, sponsored by the Grants Pass branch of the American Assn. of University Women, will be presented in the Grants Pass High School library June 27, 28 and 29.

The show is open to all artists in Southern Oregon who wish to submit work done in the past five years in any media, including oil, watercolor, pastel, charcoal and ink. Up to five entries will be accepted from each artist, and an entry fee will be charged. Pictures will be classified into elementary, junior high and senior high school and adult divisions.

Oil paintings must be framed, others may be matted. Each picture should be titled and accompanied by a statement of value for insurance purposes.

No advance registration is required for the show; entries will be received at the high school library June 22 and 23 from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. The pictures will be hung June 24 and 25 and judged June 26, at which time winners will be announced.

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Children Identity Program Is Urged Of PTA Council

Selby asked that PTA people directly help and carry out a program of complete identification of all school children. In case of an enemy invasion the whereabouts and blood type of that child can be known immediately, if that program is followed.

He also outlined the Civil Defense program now being introduced to the high schools. He stated that of 30 high schools in Douglas County, only two have refused to offer the voluntary defense program to senior students.

Kenneth Barneburg, superintendent of Douglas County schools, installed the new council officers.
