## Drastic Cutback In U. S. Foreign Aid Would Lose Cold War, Committee Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — A majority of the House Foreign Affairs Committee said this week that a drastic cutback in U.S. foreign aid would inevitably mean that we would lose the cold war.

"It is essential to our security that we continue to give assistance to foreign nations," the committee said in a report recommending a \$3,603,000,000 aid program for the coming year.

That's the amount the committee approved last month after trimming 339 million dollars from the total sought by President Eisenhower.

With an estimated 600,000

American workers in factory and farm jobs dependent on foreign aid purchases, the report said, a heavy aid slash would "disrupt the U.S. economy" and cause further unemployment.

The committee thus sought to bolster the aid bill against attacks when the big measure comes up for expected House consideration next week.

The report was adopted by a 22-5 vote but names of the dissenters were not announced. They were reported to be preparing a minority report.

Renewing his plea for the embattled aid program, Eisenhower said at a Republican dinner Tuesday night Russia has turned increasingly from military to economic attacks on the noncommu-

nist world. He added: "Either we stand idly by and watch this tremendous forced funnel into violence, dissolution of orderly government and communist exploitation. Or—we help channel it into better education and improved living standards and thereby strengthen peace and freedom everywhere in the world."

### Norblad Proposes Oregon Receive Reimbursement

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Walter Norblad (R-Ore.) Thursday proposed the government reimburse Oregon for its expenses arising out of an Air Force decision, later reversed, to build an air base at French Prairie.

He said the state originally planned to build a new correctional institution at the site, but dropped its plans when the Air Force decided to locate there.

By the time the Air Force changed its mind, Norblad said, the state was too far along with its plans at another location.

"The result of these events," he said in a statement accompanying introduction of his reimbursement bill Thursday, "was a loss to the state in the sum of \$6,144,98 for planning, study and architectural work."

He said the bill was introduced at the request of the Oregon Board of Control.
