Busching, college consultant at California State College, Stockton and at College of the Pacific, San Francisco, was guest speaker. The program also included panel discussions. The project is sponsored jointly by the AAUW branches at Ashland and in Roseburg and the Rotary Clubs of both cities contribute toward expenses.

Miss Randall added that while the delegation this year consisted of girls, it is hoped that some boys will attend later conferences.

Miss LeMarche plans to do her research work at either the University of North Carolina or Duke University and for her thesis she will, "Investigate the nature and sources of the increasing literature on the Civil War and the reasons for the resurgence of interest in that period."

Miss LeMarche received her Bachelor of Arts at U of O in 1956 and has served as a graduate assistant in history at the University during the current year. She was rated second among the six seniors elected to Phi Beta Kappa. The grantee was chosen by a committee of four appointed by Miss Maurine Lober, state president of AAUW, assisted by consultants from each of the nine member colleges, according to correspondent Hazel March.
