U. S. Supreme Court Denies Patterson Appeal

SALEM — The United States Supreme Court has denied the appeal of Frank V. Patterson, Portland, who was refused admission to the state bar on grounds of his association with the Communist Party. The highest court refused to accept jurisdiction in the case. The Oregon Supreme Court, which was notified this week of the U. S. Supreme Court's action, had denied Patterson admission to the bar. The state court said that Patterson was untruthful when he said the Communist Party did not believe in overthrow of the government by force and violence. Patterson said he had been expelled by the party.
