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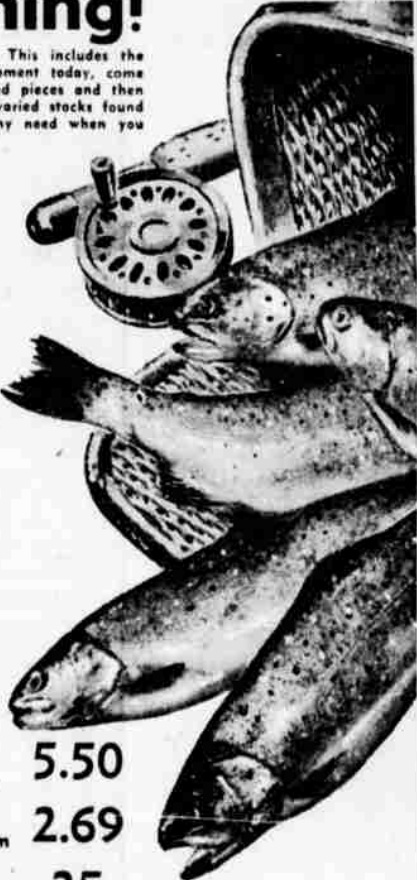

Yakima's Bears have climbed out of the cellar and Eugene has slipped into third place in the Northwest League.

The position shuffle came Thursday night as Yakima slapped a 10-inning 7-3 defeat on Tri-City, Eugene's Emeralds swamped Salem, 6-2, and Wenatchee crept up one game on loop leading Lewiston, 8-4.

Yakima has now won three straight from the sliding Tri-City Braves and still has one more crack at them on Tri-City's home field as the two clubs meet again Friday night.

The Bears came from behind in the ninth with four runs to knot the score, 5-5, and send it into extra innings. But it didn't take Yakima long to serve notice it wanted out of last place.

Bears Grab Fifth
The Bears moved two runs across in the top of the tenth to move into fifth spot, showing Tri-City down one notch into fourth place.

At Eugene, the Emeralds scored four runs in the eighth to break a 2-2 tie and take over third in the NWL standings.

Plant Of 80,000 Fish Due In Streams Here

With fishing remaining largely unspectacular in the Umpqua watershed because of the late trout opening on the river, anglers are anticipating the May 24 opener.

J. W. Vaughn, regional administrator for the Oregon Game Commission, says he'll have two tank trucks busy next week planting the streams of the watershed with legal-sized rainbow.

About 80,000 fish will be released during the week. It will be one of two plants during the season, the other coming during the summer. The fish now are in holding ponds at Rock Creek Hatchery.

36,000 Due
The North Umpqua River is due to receive some 36,000 of the trout, with 12,000 to be released Tuesday and a like amount Wednesday. Eight thousand will be introduced

SEATTLE (AP) — The Seattle Bakers have joined the National Industrial Basketball League, top amateur hoop circuit of the country.

Bud Howard, the team's general manager, telephoned the news Wednesday from Kansas City, where he was attending an NIBL meeting.

The Bakers, he said, will take over the Kansas City franchise in a loop that, traditionally, wins the national AAU championship. As outsiders, the Bakers won it in 1956.

Howard said the team will open its schedule the second week in December here against either Wichita or Denver. Other teams include Bartlesville, Okla.; Peoria Cats and Peoria Wingfoots.

The Russian national team, planning an American tour in February, may include the Bakers on the schedule, Howard reported.

Last place Los Angeles ended its losing streak at six—longest since 1950 for the Dodgers—with an 11-inning, 4-2 victory at Chicago.

The Redlegs had to come from behind at Pittsburgh after leading 3-0. George Crowe drove in five runs for the Reds, clouting a two-run homer in the seventh for a 5-4 edge that ended the Pirates' winning string at six.

Bob Friend lost his second against five victories, leaving in a four-run ninth capped by Crowe's two-run single.

Mays Raps Homer
Willie Mays hit his ninth homer, eighth in six games for a 1-0 lead in the first for the Giants and Jim Davenport's triple made it 3-0 in the second as unbeaten Mike McCormick won his third with relief help. Lindy McDaniel lost his third in five decisions although the Cards outlasted the Giants 11-9. Stan Musial was 6-for-4, losing 21 points for a .478 average.

A walk and slow motion fielding by catcher Sammy Taylor and losing reliever Hersh Freeman on two bunts handed the Dodgers two runs in the 11th. Clem Labine, making his first regular season start since Sept. 29, 1956, was the winner — his first victory since beating the Cubs in relief last July 21.

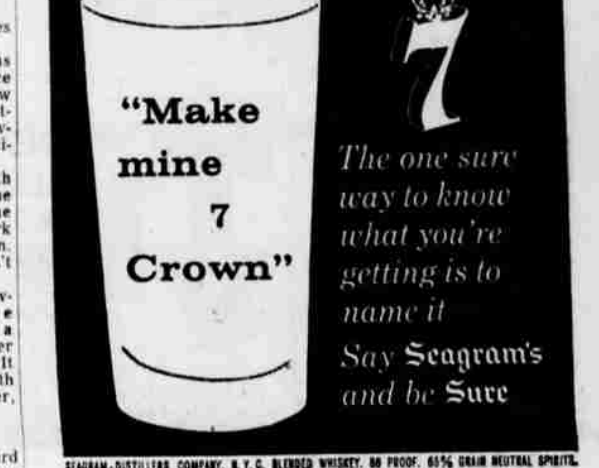

Giants Win
The Braves were trailing 3-1 when last night's game was postponed by first-inning rain at Philadelphia. That left Milwaukee in shaky command of first place—by .024 percentage points over the San Francisco Giants, who ended the St. Louis Cardinals' winning

streak at seven, 5-2.
