5 Relatives Died At 62 So Party Occurs Day Ahead

WASHINGTON, Vt. — Nate Flint, helped by some 5,000 guests celebrated his birthday Sunday and then looked forward to his 62nd anniversary which came today.

Flint, a Barre lumber dealer, explains he held his party early because both his parents as well as a sister and two brothers all died at the age of 62 and he wanted to be sure he'd be around for his party.

What a party! Invited through newspaper ads, so many people came that few were able to say more than happy birthday to Nate. He and his wife and brother, Jake, were hemmed in most of the day by crowds, all eager to shake hands.

"I looked," said Nate with typical frugality of words, "like Vermont's biggest birthday party ever."

Who could dispute it? Nate reckons the ice cream and cake as well as burro rides for the children — and there were plenty of them — would cost at least twice the \$300 and \$400 he estimated.

Two bands entertained and a large tent protected the throng from a hard rain which fell for a time during the five hour festivity.

The guests, admonished to bring no presents, just a card, heeded Nate's instructions. They filled a 55 gallon drum with birthday cards.

Police were busy most of the day with traffic, which at one time was backed up a mile. The police estimated more than 2,000 cars were parked on Route 110.

Roseburg Bands Given High Praise By Adjudicator

All four Roseburg public school bands participating in the first annual "Parade of Bands" Saturday night were given high evaluations by Dr. Glenn Bainum, nationally known music educator from North-western University in Evanston, Ill.

Bainum heard the bands after conducting clinics for band directors Friday evening and Saturday afternoon. He was in Roseburg under the sponsorship of the Roseburg instrumental music department and Ricketts Music Store.

Participating in the evaluation session were Joseph Lane Junior High School band, under the direction of Ralph Anderson; Central Junior High School Band, directed by Robert Lenniville, and the cadet and concert bands from Roseburg High school. The high school bands are directed by Harold Withnell, director of instrumental music for Roseburg public schools.

Withnell said the "Parade of Bands" will become an annual event, with a well-known music adjudicator brought in each year to evaluate the instrumental program.

Bainum praised the four bands for their musicianship, intonation, precision and all-around musical worthiness Saturday. Each band played three selections, which Bainum used as a basis for his evaluative reports.

McElhenny Signs San Francisco Pact

SAN FRANCISCO — Versatile Hugh McElhenny, who proved as elusive at end as halfback, signed his San Francisco 49er contract Friday.

Although terms were not revealed, the 198-pound offensive star was believed to be getting about \$20,000.

A star inside halfback for five years in the National Football League, McElhenny switched to end in the middle of last season when injuries hit the club.

He wound up the seventh leading pass receiver in the league with 37 catches for 458 yards. As a left halfback, he carried the ball 102 times for 478 yards and a 4.7 average.

"Sure I like playing halfback better, but if I can be of more value as an end, that's where I'll play," the 23-year-old former University of Washington All American declared.

Coach Frank Albert returned Big Mac to halfback for the season's final game and he's expected to open there this fall unless unforeseen developments again deplete the end corps.

A native of Los Angeles, McElhenny led Compton, Calif., Junior College to a national title and Little Rose Bowl championship before enrolling at Washington. He played there in 1949, 1950 and 1951, gaining All America honors in his senior year.

Fasten Breaks Records To Lead Team To Victory

ASHLAND — Jerry Fasten led an assault on meet records as Oregon Tech raced to a 74-57 track victory over Southern Oregon here Friday.

Fasten tossed the shot 46 feet, 2 inches, and then came back for a record-breaking discus performance of 136 feet, 10 1/2 inches.

Ardell Koehn Charged With Forging Signature

Ardell L. Koehn, 18, San Diego Naval Training Center, was held to answer to a forgery charge Monday following a preliminary hearing before District Judge Warren A. Woodruff.

Koehn was charged with larceny in a dwelling in connection with the theft of a U.S. Treasury check from an apartment house at 908 SE Pine St. a week ago. The judge found evidence insufficient to hold Koehn on the larceny charge but adjudged that there was sufficient cause to hold the defendant on a forgery charge.

Testimony indicated that Koehn accompanied his brother, Franklin Harold, 21, 605 SE Mosher Ave., when the latter cashed the forged check at a Roseburg market. Woodruff set bail at \$1,000.
