Nixon Proposes Paying Attention To SA Students

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Nixon said Wednesday it is high time for United States diplomats to pay more attention to students, labor leaders and press representatives in Latin America.

He said these groups represent "the wave of the future" in Latin American countries, with prospects they will lead their governments in the next five to ten years.

Reporting to a National Press Club luncheon on his riot-scarred visit to eight Latin American countries, Nixon strongly urged more personal contacts with citizens of the nations to the south.

He disagreed vigorously with critics who have said his attempts to debate policies with hostile Latin American students fomented riots against him and were beneath the dignity of a Vice President.

Nixon, answering a question after his address, said he deliberately met with students and labor leaders to answer criticism and "show them that there is an alternative to communism."

Moscow in an effort to bolster Red influence in Latin America, he said, is concentrating on student and labor groups.

Separate Suits Seek \$75,000

Two separate suits seeking a total of \$75,000 damages were filed in circuit court Tuesday in connection with a truck-pickup collision last Dec. 9 near Glendale.

Seeking \$70,000 damages as compensation for facial lacerations and other injuries is Judith Holmgren, 16, Glendale. Damages amounting to \$5,000 are sought for Miss Holmgren's 10-month-old brother, Mark.

Both plaintiffs are represented by their legal guardian, Lula Belle Dickerson.

The suits allege carelessness and recklessness on the part of Wallace Maurer and Gail Odum, allegedly the operators of a county dump truck with which a pickup truck driven by Floyd Irvin Emerson, Glendale, collided on Glendale Road west of Glendale. The suits allege Maurer and Odum did not use proper precautions in stopping the west-bound truck, which was struck from the rear by the Emerson vehicle.

FIRE ON MOB

CALCUTTA, India (AP) — Police fired on a mob of Communist-led steel strikers Wednesday at Jamshedpur, killing one and wounding 17. The workers were trying to rescue an arrested Communist leader of their five-day strike against India's biggest steel plant. The sitdown strike was called by the Communist-dominated workers union to protest dismissal of 44 workers for an illegal token strike May 12. The government has clamped a dusk-to-dusk curfew on the city of more than 150,000 persons.

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
