Pflimlin Tells Why He Resigned Post

PARIS (AP) — Pierre Pflimlin resigned as premier and cleared the path for Gen. De Gaulle's return to power after a navy commander refused to land troops on rebellious Corsica, reliable sources said Thursday.

Pflimlin told the story to a group of his fellow Catholic Popular Republican deputies. Deputies present confirmed the story. Pflimlin's naval landing was set for sometime between the night of the Corsican revolt, May 24 and the night of May 28, when Pflimlin dejectedly went to see President Rene Coty and offer his resignation.

He is reported to have told Coty that night that his government no longer could make its orders effective.

Pflimlin reported to his fellow deputies that after the Corsican insurrection of De Gaulle support-

ers he sent a warship with 2,000 police and security troops aboard to recapture the Corsican capital of Ajaccio. The capital was then held by only a handful of paratroopers.

"The blow had been kept in perfect secrecy," Pflimlin was quoted as saying. "The landing was to have taken place in dead of night."

"At the last moment the commander of the ship refused to enter the port and land the gendarmes."

The ship was not identified.

Mary Carol Miles, 12, and her brother, Ross, 8, then half carried and pulled their father another 200 feet up out of the reach of the incoming tide.

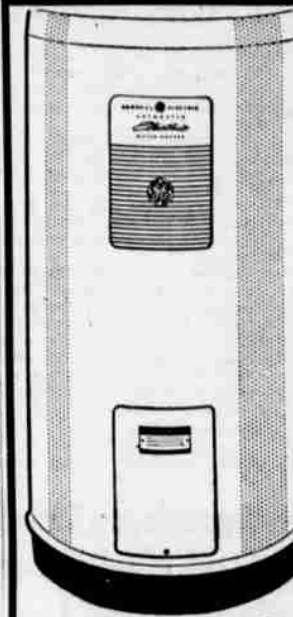
Their mother, in the family's nearby weekend cabin, heard their shouts for help and summoned neighbors.

Coroner Raymond Luce said Miles might have suffered a heart attack and been dead by the time he hit the water.
