Under a new compensation plan, the county judge is to receive the same salary as county commissioners.
Judge Keating was defeated for nomination in the May primary.

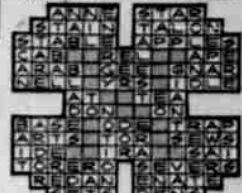

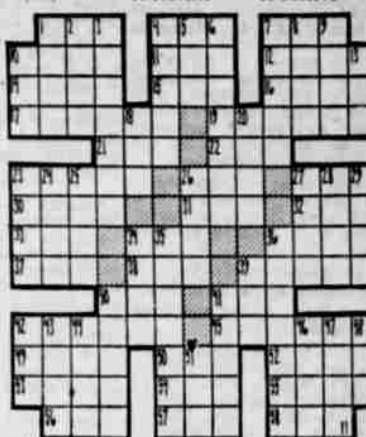
