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Fish Protection Action Urged By Sen. Neuberger

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore) has called for early Senate action on legislation to protect migratory salmon and steelhead runs of the Pacific Northwest.

Neuberger said Sunday, "These fish pilgrimages are by far the most valuable in the nation."

The Senate Commerce Committee recently approved a bill by Neuberger to require Interior Department consent to proposed fish-

protection devices in any dam licensed by the Federal Power Commission. It also would require Interior approval for structures across streams where fish spawn and migrate. He said he hopes for Senate action this week.

The senator said he believes passage of the bill would have the effect of hastening federal and state studies and research on problems of fish-passage over high dams.

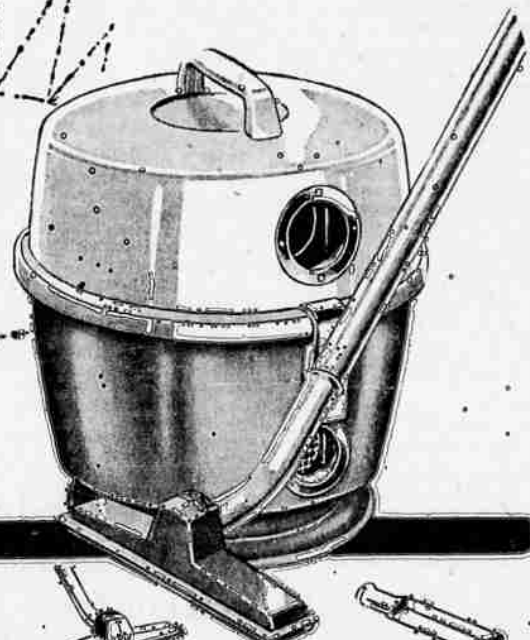
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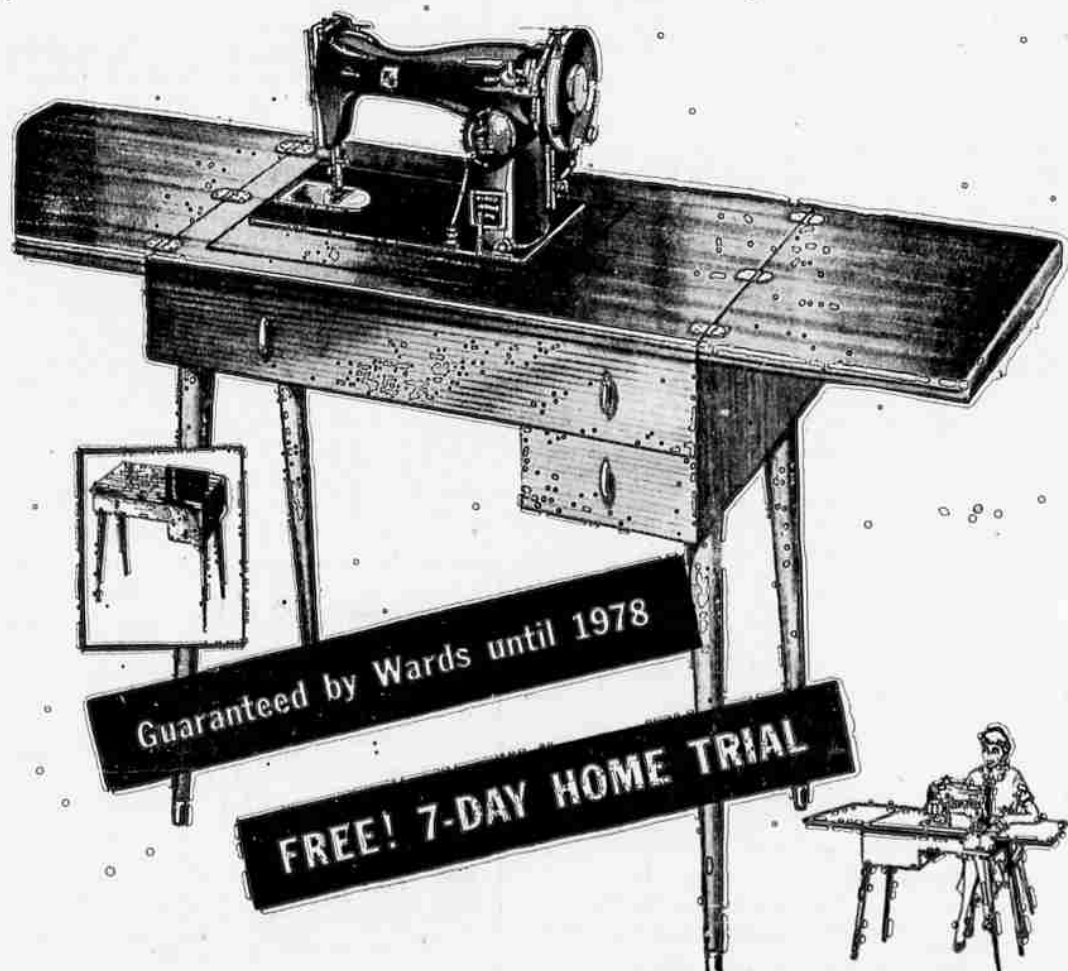
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
