Bad Grades Suspend 2 Cagers' Careers

PORTLAND (AP) — Low grades have caused the University of Portland's two tallest basketball players to be declared ineligible for play next season.
Al Negretti, athletic director, said Tuesday that Ray Scott and Bjarne Jensen, two front line stars measuring 6 feet 8 inches, have been placed on academic probation for not meeting the scholastic grade standard.

Both will be permitted to return to the school next fall, Negretti said, but they can not play basketball.
Scott, who played high school basketball in Philadelphia and joined Portland last February, led the club in scoring and rebounding.
Jensen, former Portland high school star who came to Portland U after briefly attending the University of Oregon, had not played for the Pilots last season. But he had been expected to move into the tall front line with Scott and Jim Altenhofen this season.

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BURBANK, Calif. (AP) — Border to border and coast to coast in 17 hours and 50 minutes.
That's the record of a Lockheed JetStar, a new utility transport plane.
The plane, piloted by Ray Goudey and Bob Schumacker, took off at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif., shortly before midnight Monday. It touched down in Washington, Massachusetts and Florida before returning here yesterday. The actual flying time: 14 hours 50 minutes. Its average speed was 456 m.p.h. for the 6,700-mile flight.
The jet made stops at McChord AFB near Tacoma, Wash., Westover AFB near Chicopee, Falls, Mass., and McCoy AFB near Orlando, Fla.

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
