

Local Golfers Move Ahead In Junior Tourney

Three Roseburg golfers continued to advance in the Oregon State Junior golf championships in Portland Wednesday, however, two others were ousted from the tourney.

In the junior division, Rick Peterson and Ron Perrault both advanced with wins and in the boys division Tom Kabler won his quarter-final match.

In boys championship play, Roseburg's Chuck Allen lost out to the tournament favorite Lynn Iturri of Ontario, 4 and 3. And in the second flight of the junior division, Ralph Helton lost to Harlan Bridenbaugh of Riverside, 3 and 2.

Advancing into the semi-finals of the junior play in the third flight were Peterson who defeated Bob Cone of Royal Oaks 6 and 5 and Perrault who dropped Tom Smythe of Oswego 4 and 3.

Moving into the semi-finals of the boys division third flight is Kabler who downed Cliff Goldman of Riverside 4 and 3.

In Thursday's play Kabler met Doug Norton of Columbia-Edgewater; Peterson met Steve Hamacher of Eugene and Perrault met Steve Schenk of Oswego.

Yank Rook Duren New Sensation

NEW YORK (AP) — Rino (Ryne) Duren, the newest bullpen sensation of the New York Yankees, almost overnight became the most exciting pitcher in the major leagues.

Why? How? Bill DeWitt, former president of the St. Louis Browns, who had Duren originally, thinks it's because he has finally curbed his wildness.

Ralph Houk, Yankee coach for whom Duren won 13 while losing two at Denver, thinks he has gained confidence.

Yankee Manager Casey Stengel thinks the switch from a starter to a relief specialist has brought out the best in his prize rookie. The bespectacled Duren believes it was the tutelage of Frank (Lefty) O'Doul at Vancouver in 1956 that is responsible.

"Lefty took great pains with me," Duren explains. "He was patient and understanding. He showed me the value of moving the ball, of placing the pitch in so many areas of the strike zone. I had a terrible first half season at Vancouver, losing seven of my first nine decisions. With his help I was able to win nine of the last 13."

Duren, 29, considered excess baggage in the Billy Martin-Harry Simpson trade of a year ago, wasn't given much of a chance to stick with the Yankees this year. But Stengel, apparently sensing that Bob Grim had had it, decided to gamble with Duren in relief.

Bahama Considers Welter Career After Gavilan Win

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Young Yama Bahama considered a campaign in the welterweight boxing ranks today after belting out a solid victory over former welter king Kid Gavilan.

Bahama, 25, a former fishing guide from Bimini, took a quick early lead over Gavilan in their televised fight last night in the Miami Beach Auditorium and the Cuban Hawk, a slowed-down brawler at 32, had nothing with which to rally.

Judge Eddie Thal gave Bahama the most one-sided score, 100-92. Referee Jimm, Peerless scored it 98-94 and Judge Stu Winston 99-93. Bahama was a 98-93 winner on The Associated Press card.

The victory was the 29th for Bahama against eight losses and one draw. At 151½ pounds, he was just a half pound heavier than the Cuban Kid. Gavilan's career record now is 106-30-6.

Favored at only 7-5, Bahama ganged Gavilan freely with a hard straight left and often followed up with strong rights to the head.

Gavilan's once-famous flurries just weren't there. Whenever the Kid tried to launch one, moving in with his stamping feet, Bahama quickly knocked him out of the notion. Only in the sixth round did Gavilan look good. Then, for a brief moment, his bolo punches seemed to confuse Bahama. But Yama quickly got the hang of them.
