Mrs. Earl Lozier Representative For Presbyterian Meet

Mrs. Earl Lozier of the First Presbyterian Church will represent Southwest Oregon Presbyterian Society at the fifth quadrennial national meeting of Presbyterian Women's organizations, at Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana, June 25 through July 1.

More than 5,000 delegates from women's organization of local Presbyterian and overseas churches will attend the week long meeting. Among the special guests at the national meeting will be representatives of Presbyterian Societies of the United Presbyterian Church of North America, which this month became united with the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A.

The newly elected executive committee, representing the women's organizations of both churches, will meet at the conclusion of the National meeting as the first official gathering of United Presbyterian Women.

Overseas guests of the Presbyterian women will come from churches in Egypt, Czechoslovakia, Cuba, Brazil, Alaska, Chile, Mexico, Indonesia, and Camerons, West Africa. Highlight of the meeting will be adoption July 1, of a "Charter for Christian Action," which was developed out of a study made by 4,000 groups of church women during the past year, of problems facing the church locally, nationally and world-wide.

LDS Church Leader Slated At Eugene

A prominent official of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints will address a conference of the Willamette Stake of the church in Eugene this Saturday and Sunday.

Elder Marion D. Hanks, member of the First Council of Seventy, will be the visitor. General conference sessions will be conducted at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Sunday in the Stake House, 10th and Tyler St., Eugene. The meetings are open to the public.

Included in the stake are wards, from Corvallis, Eugene, Roseburg, Salem, Springfield, Albany, Cottage Grove, Lebanon, Myrtle Creek and Sweet Home.

Freak Fish Has Anglers Puzzled

LONDON (AP)—Two Welsh fishermen called in scientific help today to identify a 20-pound fish with two short legs and tiny webbed feet.

The fish was four feet long. Its legs were about eight inches long extending from its hind fins. Trevor and David Jones hooked it on a long line last night from a row-boat in Cardigan Bay, in Wales.

The fishermen kept it alive in the water-filled bottom of their boat and took it to the local fish expert in Aberystwyth, Wales.

The expert, Evan Hughes, said he had never seen anything like it and that officials of the government fisheries office would come to Aberystwyth to examine it.

The fish has a dark brown body with front fins resembling a skate a flat head measuring about nine inches, slit eyes shaped like half-moons, a tail and rear fins like those of dog-fish — and those legs!
