

Conferees Agree Upon Water Projects Measure

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Senate-House conference committee agreed Tuesday on a compromise version of a bill to authorize 1 1/2 billion dollars of water projects. It is a version which Sen. Robert Kerr (D-Okla.) has said meets all administration objections.

President Eisenhower twice has vetoed similar bills in recent years, once in 1956 and again earlier this year.

The conference group composed comparatively minor differences between the House and Senate version by accepting almost intact the Senate measure.

The report now goes back to the Senate and House.

The bill does not carry any actual funds. Congress must appropriate required money before the projects can be built.

Horror Of Brazil Blast Of Fireworks Described

SALVADOR, Brazil (AP)—An awesome fireworks explosion in a festive northern Brazil market place trapped hundreds of men, women and children Monday and hurled bodies in all directions.

There were two fireworks disasters less than 30 miles apart, and the toll ran to about 100 dead and 400 injured.

Many of the victims were mothers and children who died instantly in the municipal market at Santo Amaro, where they were celebrating holy days with fireworks.

Medical workers and supplies were rushed to Santo Amaro. Disaster workers hampered by torrential rains, brought out torn and charred bodies.

Schultz said the session will consist of four one-week periods, with 20 boys to be enrolled each week. Boys will meet at Central Junior High School playground each morning at 8:30 throughout the duration of the session, he added.

Participants in the day camp will be transported by bus to the site of the camp north of Cloverdale. They will be returned for a recreational swim at 4 p.m. at the city pool, where parents may call to pick them up.

Lunches will be provided by parents, while the YMCA will provide milk. Boys will attend camp Monday through Friday, with an overnight camp-out planned for Friday night of each week of the session.

Schultz said the program includes crafts, hikes, archery, camp crafts, games, fishing and other activities. Fee for each week will be \$8, which covers transportation, milk and all activities including the afternoon swim.

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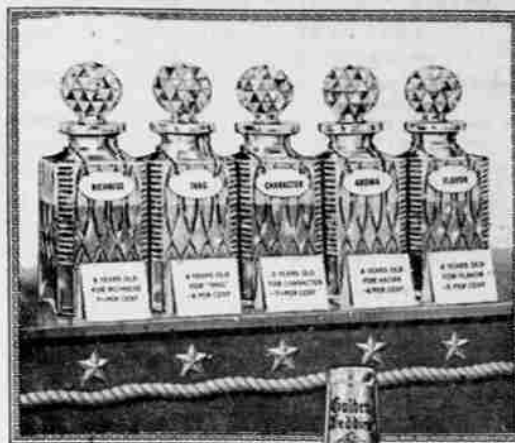
BRIDGE TO BE OPENED
