

Harvest Time Wheat Price May Drop To Lowest Level

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agricultural Marketing Service said Monday harvest time prices of wheat may drop to the lowest levels in 13 years.

Factors pointing to such a decline — which would be about 25 per cent below a year earlier — include prospects for the fourth largest crop of record, a lower government price support level and ineligibility of part of the crop for price support aid.

A report on the wheat situation said average farm prices as low as \$1.45 a bushel are possible this summer. The last time harvest period prices were that low was in the summer of 1945. A year ago, summer prices ran around \$1.90.

This prospect was expected to lead many farmers to store their wheat under price support loans, which will average about \$1.82 a bushel. The support rate averaged \$2 last year.

Not Eligible For Support

The marketing service said, however, that a considerable quantity of wheat will not be eligible for price support loans because it was grown on acreages in excess of allotments. Loans are limited to farms complying with allotments.

The report said wheat prices may strengthen after the heavy market movement slackens following harvest.

Prices of durum wheat, the kind used in making macaroni, spaghetti and like foods, are expected to average higher than most other types because supplies of it are not large.

Investigators To Look Into Real Estate Ad Operations

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congressional investigators next week will look into reports that real estate advertising operations which have come under attack from the Federal Trade Commission have flourished anyhow.

Sen. Henry Jackson (D-Wash.), announcing hearings July 9 by the Senate Investigations subcommittee, said small businessmen, farmers, widows and other property owners are being fleeced of 50 million dollars a year.

Under investigation are firms which solicit advertising of properties for sale. FTC complaints charge that these ads are sold under false pretenses and seldom result in the sale of property.

Ads Costly

The ads appear in the companies' publications and cost anywhere from \$100 to \$3,000.

In 1955, when the FTC first became interested in these enterprises, there were an estimated 20 companies in the field.

There have been recent estimates that there are now 70 firms operating in California alone, despite increasing FTC scrutiny.

Trade Commission action has put five companies out of business to date. However, FTC sources said some of their victories have

turned into defeats of a sort, with employees of padlocked firms starting new companies.

Five businesses were formed by employees of just one firm, an FTC lawyer said. He estimated such an operation can be started with \$500-\$1,000 of capital and added that he knows of a one-man operation that grosses \$750,000 a year.

Consider Legislation

The Senate investigators will consider legislation to make the fraudulent sale of real estate advertising a federal criminal offense.

FTC complaints allege that the advertising is sold through this sort of pie-in-the-sky promise.

"I know someone looking for a piece of property just like yours. I'm sure we can turn up a buyer."

"You're not asking enough for your business. Boost the price to 50 thousand."

The commission charges that there are no prospective buyers, the properties usually are amply priced to start with, and refunds aren't forthcoming.

Firms against which FTC complaints are pending include: Union Interchange Inc., Seattle, Denver and Los Angeles.

Grounded River Boat To Be Refloated Tuesday

LEWISTON, Idaho (AP) — The grounded river boat Wenaha, stranded 71 miles up the Snake River, is due to be refloated Tuesday when more water is released to the stream.

The 52-foot boat with 10 passengers aboard got hung up last Thursday when the river level dropped three feet. The Idaho Power Co. impounded water upstream for its Brownlee Dam project.

But a conflict with movement of salmon in the river forced postponement until tomorrow, he said. The Wenaha carries mail and supplies two days a week on a 83-mile route to families living along the river. It also has space for about 50 tourists.

Capt. Keith Rodenbaugh, boat operator for the Inland Navigation Co., said Idaho Power had planned to release a surge of water Saturday to put the Wenaha back in business.

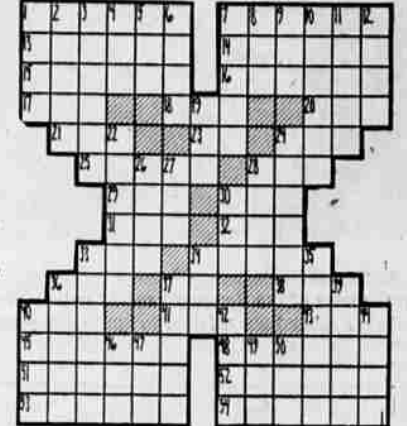
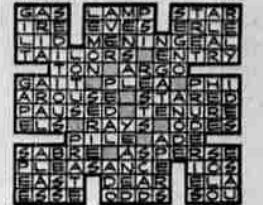
