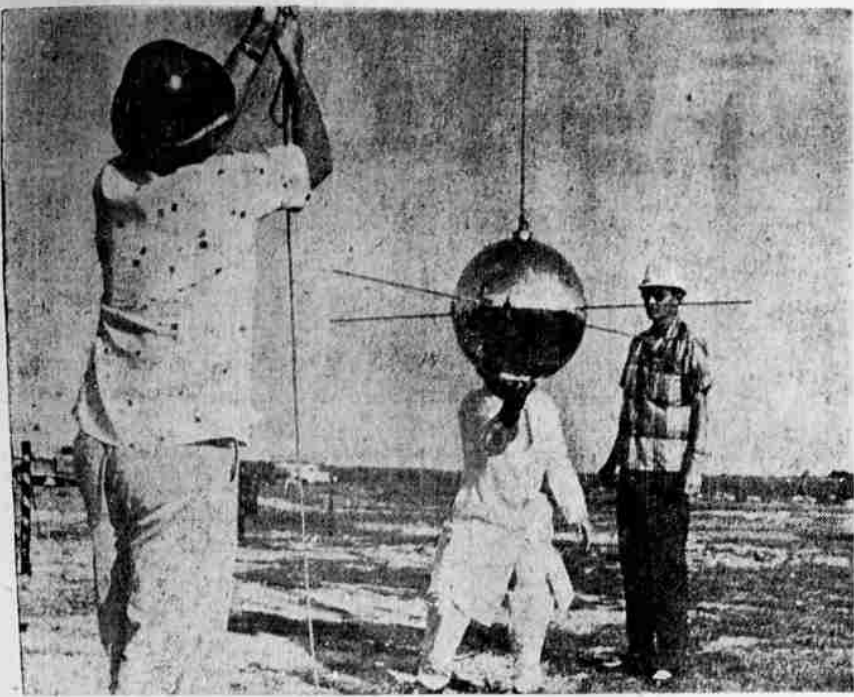
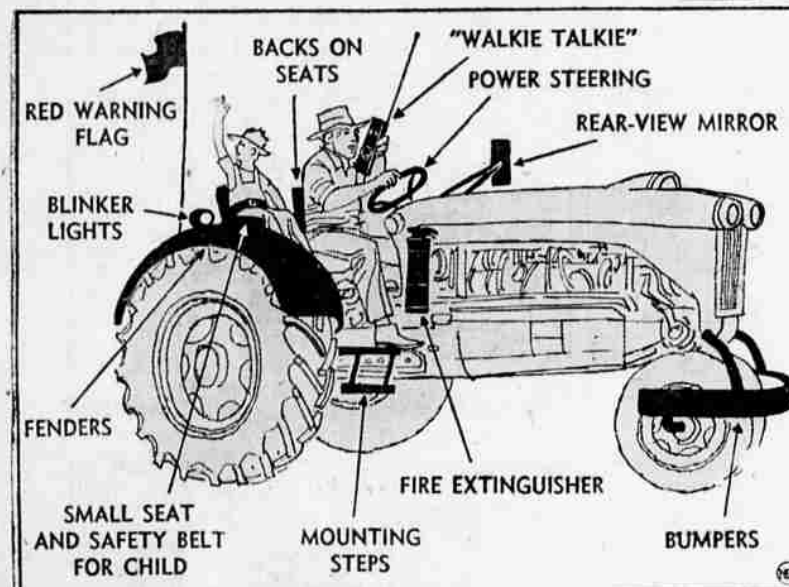

ENGINEERED FOR SAFETY — Farm people lose more time from injuries than any other working group. In Ohio, accidental deaths on the farm rank third, led only by the construction and mining industries. Because accidents involving tractors stand high on the list, 1,800 women of the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation conducted a survey asking farmers' suggestions for additional safety features on these machines. Some 15,000 farmers were interviewed in 53 Ohio counties. Drawing above incorporates a few of their suggestions in a model safety-first tractor. Other ideas include an "upset warning" device, tow cables, springs and a lower top speed.

Oregon Congressional Delegates Votes Listed

WASHINGTON (AP) — How Oregon members of Congress were recorded as voting on recent rollcalls:

Senate
On rejection, 29-50, of Monroney (D-Okla.) amendment to Alaska statehood bill to grant Alaska commonwealth status rather than statehood; Morse (D) and Neuberger (D), against the amendment.

House
On rejection, 171-214, of resolution providing for consideration of omnibus farm bill, thus in effect killing bill; Ullman (D), Green (D) and Porter (D), for resolution; Norblad (R), against.
On rejection, 226-145, of bill authorizing appointment of an assistant secretary of state for African affairs; Ullman, Green and Porter, for bill; Norblad, against.

ELGIN, Ore. (AP)—A little boy ran behind a school lawn mower just as it was backing up Monday, and lost his left leg above the knee.

The boy, Bobby Snyder, who will be 4 years old next month, was in surgery two hours after the accident which occurred as he was romping on the school grounds. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Delmar Snyder, cafe proprietors here.

A 72-year-old retiring Bureau of Public Roads employee, Hugh Taylor, was feted Sunday at a picnic attended by bureau personnel from Vancouver, Wash.; Portland, Salem, Coquille and Douglas County. Taylor wound up a long career with the bureau with four years of service in Douglas County. Previous to that, he had worked on the Alcan, Cascade Lakes, and Republic - Kettle Falls highways. In his local tenure, he served as engineering aide on the North Umpqua Highway and other projects.

PHONING IN THE DARK
NORTHLAKE, Ill. (AP)—An illuminated telephone dial has been developed.

It takes the guess work and eye-strain out of night-time telephone dialing in an unlighted room. The design incorporates a "Panel-ent" lamp as the source of light that shows through translucent numerals and letters.

No bulbs, tubes, filaments or cathodes are required in this lamp. It consists of a porcelainized steel sheet with a ceramic-phosphor coating. It utilizes the principle of electro-luminescence—the creation of light through the excitation of certain phosphors placed in an electric field.

Developed by Sylvania Electric Products, Inc., the lamp is said to have a useful life of 20,000 hours.

WEEK'S VACATION
MEXICO CITY (AP)—Mexico started a week's vacation from political campaigning Monday, observing the legal cool-off period before the July 6 presidential and congressional elections. The government presidential candidate, Adolfo Lopez Mateos, is considered certain to win. He ended his campaign a week ago but his Party of Revolutionary Institutions honors him with a parade and rodeo in the capital Sunday.

BRITISH POET DIES
ISLE OF WIGHT, England (AP)—Alfred Noyes, a robust British writer who made a living on poetry, died Saturday. He was 77. Probably his best known poem was "The Highwayman." Another, "The Highwayman," was made into a movie.

Prince Philip Makes Land, Sea, Air Dash

LONDON (AP)—Prince Philip, handsome husband of Queen Elizabeth II, made a 600-mile land, sea and air dash Sunday for a game of polo. Philip slipped away during a royal visit with the Queen on tiny Holy Island, three miles off the bleak northeast coast. A destroyer took him to the mainland. A waiting car whisked him to a nearby Royal Air Force Station, and a plane of the Queen's Flight flew him 200 miles to Maidenhead. A short drive to Windsor, the royal family's country home, and Philip was ready for the big game 300 miles from his starting point. He scored two goals to help his team to win. The Prince flew 300 miles to catch up with the Queen again in Scotland.
