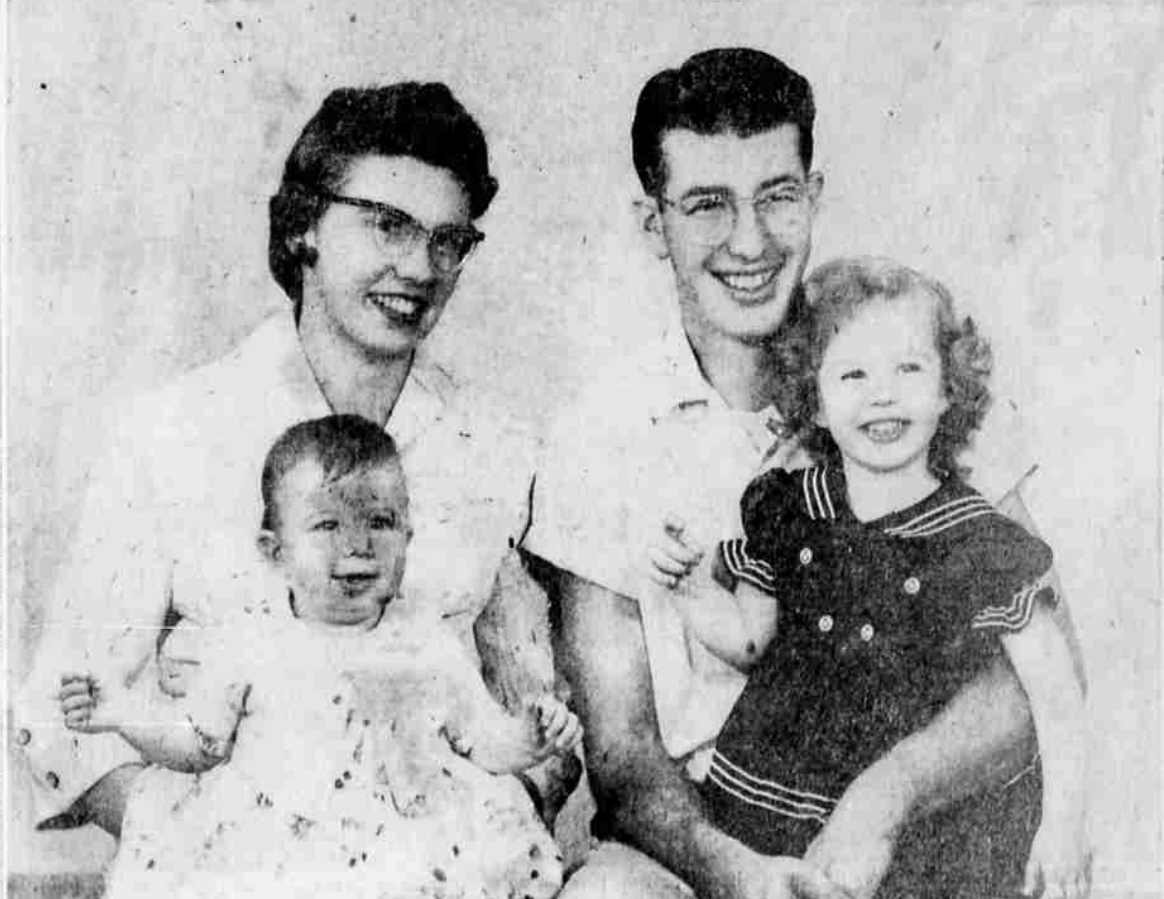
MISS GLADYS VINCENT HONORED AT BRIDAL SHOWER
