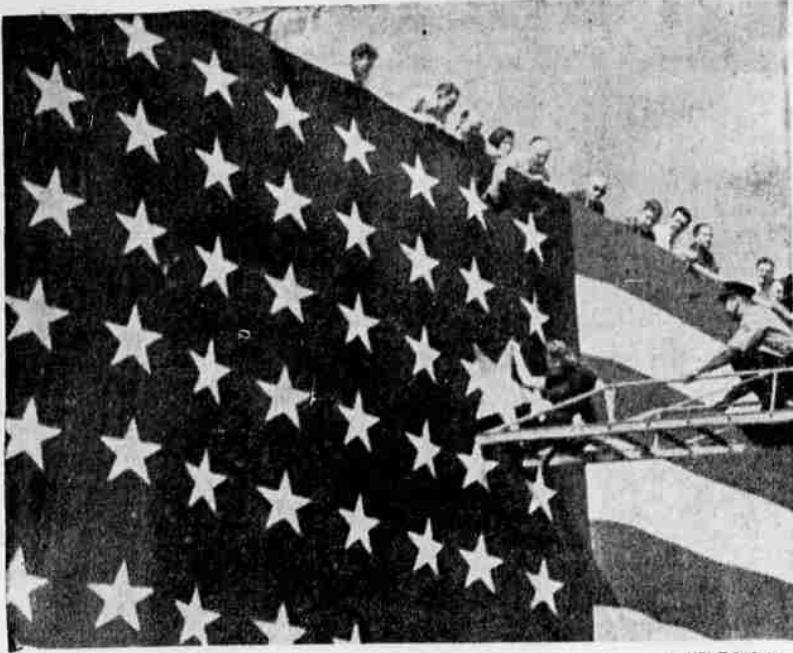

Rescuer Drowns During Effort To Repeat Deed

LONG BEACH, N. C. (AP) — A father and daughter bade each other goodbye upon realizing they were drowning in the Atlantic Sunday.

However, he was rescued by another man who himself drowned in a vain effort to rescue the daughter.

The other man, Ernest McCracken of Southport, previously had rescued another daughter, Inez Joyner, 10, who had been swept off her feet by a current on Long Beach Inlet.

Shirley Joyner, 14, of Nashville, N.C., drowned along with McCracken.

Inez first ventured into deep water and was knocked down by a current. Shirley tried to help her, and also was gripped by the current. Their screams attracted Joyner and McCracken.

McCracken towed Inez in, and Joyner went to Shirley.

"We went under several times," Joyner related. "We knew we were going to drown. We said goodbye to each other."

After McCracken rescued Joyner, he reached Shirley far out in the water. Witnesses said they appeared to struggle, and then disappeared beneath the waves of this beach near Southport and Wilmington.

Pros Tee Off In Oregon PGA

PRINEVILLE (AP) — The professionals teed off Monday morning in the qualifying round of the Oregon PGA match play golf championships at nearby Redmond, after 19-year-old Ron Weber of Prineville trimmed the pros to win the 18-hole Prineville Open and Pro-Amateur tournament Sunday.

Weber, the University of Houston golfer whose father, Alex Weber, tied for second among the professionals, shot a 539-under-par 64 on the short local course to repeat as the title holder and amateur champion.

Portland pro Bill Eggers walked off with top prize money of \$600 with his 65, one stroke ahead of four other swingers. They were the elder Weber, Ed Oldfield of Astoria, Larry Lamberger, Portland, and Bill Wilkinson, Redmond, all with 66s. Each collected \$287.50 in prize money.

Finishing with 67s and \$150 apiece were Bunny Mason of Salem, Harvey Hixson of Eugene, and Harold West of Longview.

One stroke behind them with 68s were Royce Doyle and Bill Johnson, both of Portland, and Oswego's Bob McKendrick.

Trailing young Weber by two strokes in the amateur bracket were Millard Porter of Prineville and Don Krieger of Portland, both with 66s.

Monday's action was at the Juniper Golf Club at Redmond, where qualifying for the PGA match play began at 8 a.m. The top 32 qualifiers tee off in the first round Monday afternoon.

The Redmond tourney continues through Thursday.

Ed O'Brien Seen New SU Head; Faccone Goes

SEATTLE (AP) — Joe Faccone was released Friday as Seattle University baseball coach in a move expected to clear the way for the appointment of Eddie O'Brien as SU's new athletic director.

Faccone, an alumnus, was told that reorganization of the athletic department prompted the decision not to rehire him. He had coached three years.

O'Brien, one of the famed twins who helped lift Seattle in the early 50s to national recognition as a basketball power, is considered the likely choice to succeed John Castellini as athletic director. Castellini, also head basketball coach, resigned after the 1957-58 season.

O'Brien now is a pitcher with Salt Lake City of the Pacific Coast League.

Shanley Weds UO Queen Sunday In Coos Bay

COOS BAY (AP) — Jim Shanley, star halfback on the 1958 University of Oregon Rose Bowl team and in the North-South Senior Bowl game, was married to the university's homecoming queen, Mary Jo Fourier, here Sunday.

The couple was graduated from North Bend High School and the university together. They announced their engagement on the eve of Oregon's homecoming game with Oregon State College last fall.

Rafer Expected To Surprise Russians

PALMYRA, N.J. (AP) — If all goes according to plan, there are going to be a lot of pop-eyed Russians when big Rafer Johnson finishes his decathlon performance in Moscow July 28.

"Rafer should break the world record and clobber that Russian," predicted Johnson's coach, Dickey Drake. "The Russian is good, and it ought to be interesting to watch but Rafer will win."

The Russian Drake referred to is Vasily Kuznetsov — big, talented and eager. Right now, he has an all-time world record of 8,016 points pending.

Johnson, a quiet-spoken 200-pounder, who is president of UCLA's student body, holds the current listed world record of 7,985 points.

He won the National AAU championship here Saturday with 7,754 points.

Yang Chuan Kwang of Free China finished a strong second with 7,625 points, an all-time high for him.

Dave Edstrom, 19-year-old University of Oregon sophomore, was third with 7,154 and will also join the team making the Moscow trip.

Bob Lawson of the Southern California Striders, formerly of Aberdeen, Wash., was fifth with 6,550 points.

A 150-million-dollar contract with Martin Aircraft Co. was recently announced by the Air Force for Dynosor (from "dynamic soaring"). Boosted to 17,000 m.p.h.—near satellite speed—by the liquid-fueled Titan, the airplane-space ship could glide around the world one or more times and bring its pilot back to earth, according to the Air Force.

Flight testing of the Titan alone is expected to begin early next winter. No target date for the Dynosor combination has been made public.
