



U. S. Marshal Resigns Position In Portland

PORTLAND (AP) — Fred Sexton, U.S. marshal here for five years, said here today that he has resigned.

Only a few months ago he was reappointed by President Eisenhower to the \$9,200-a-year job. Sexton, 63, said he will enter private business.

His successor will be appointed by the President and Paul Kearney, Clatsop County sheriff, is expected to be recommended.

Republican National Committee member Robert T. Mautz said he knew of no other candidate. Rep. Walter Norblad said in Washington he would recommend Kearney.

Aged Man, In Collapse, Found In Desert Area

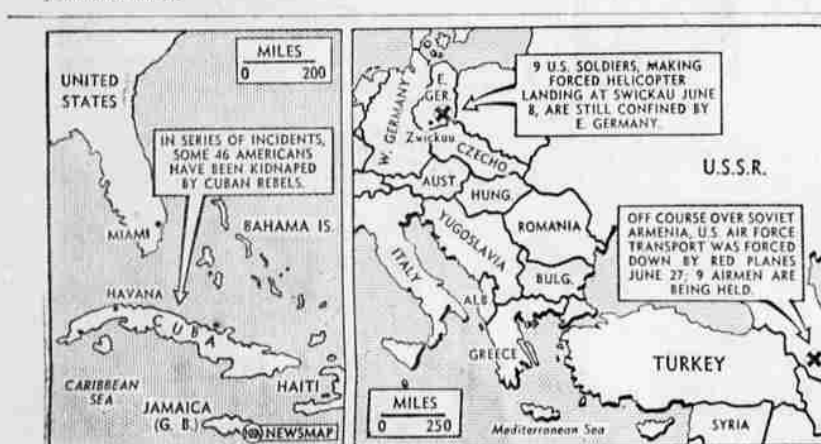
PRINEVILLE (AP) — Dazed and exhausted from hours of exposure to 90-degree heat, an 85-year-old Prineville man was rescued by his son and a helicopter pilot Sunday from lonely desert country near Powell Butte.

Frank Brown had driven into the area Saturday morning, heading for a ranch. His car became stuck on a back road and he tried to walk to the Prineville-Redmond highway.

He got about four miles before collapsing from the heat on a high ridge.

Ransom for the eight officers and one sergeant held by E. Germany has been set tantamount to official U.S. recognition of the Communist puppet government. Cuban rebel kidnappings — of both U.S. servicemen and civilians — took place ostensibly as retaliation against claimed American aid to Cuban army planes at the U.S. Naval Base at Guantanamo Bay, on the south coast of rebel-infested Oriente Province. In the third incident, involving another forced landing of an American aircraft on foreign soil, Russia demands U.S. admission of "deliberate" border crossing and assurances to "prevent violations" in the future.
