

Mrs. Bera Winner Of Powder Puff Derby 4th Time

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP) — Mrs. Francis Bera of Long Beach, Calif., was named Wednesday as winner of the 12th annual transcontinental Powder Puff derby for women pilots. It was the fourth time she has won the event.

The 2,178-mile air race started at San Diego, Calif., Friday and ended at Charleston, with the deadline for arrival noon Tuesday. Mrs. Bera, with her co-pilot, Mrs. Evelyn Kelly, also of Long Beach, had an average ground speed of 177.8 miles per hour.

The winners of the race were announced Wednesday after handicaps were figured for the 48 small planes that finished from a field of 61.

Thirteen other planes either were disqualified or failed to meet Tuesday's deadline. Second place went to Mrs. Pauline Glassom and her co-pilot, Miss Mary Ann Smothers, both of Corpus Christi, Tex. Mrs. Gertrude Howard of College Station, Tex., and Mrs. Barbara Anspaugh of Lincoln, Neb., her co-pilot, were third.

Mrs. Bera won the race in 1953, 1955 and 1956.

Ingrid-Roberto Marriage Bond Severed In Rome

ROME (AP) — A prosecutor's notice of appeal today delayed annulment of the marriage of Ingrid Bergman and Roberto Rossellini. The presiding judge of Rome's First District Court announced today that the court had annulled the eight-year marriage of the Swedish film star and the Italian movie director.

The Italian movie man in his suit had contended that Miss Bergman's Mexican divorce from Dr. Peter Lindstrom in 1950 was not recognized by Swedish or Italian law and therefore their subsequent Mexican proxy marriage had never existed.

Elia said the court had accepted Rossellini's contentions but that the decision would not be final until after the prosecutor's appeal was heard.

Miss Bergman has announced that she plans to marry wealthy Lars Schmidt, a Swede, as soon as legally possible.

Rossellini has been involved with Sonali Das Gupta, the wife of an Indian movie executive, who abandoned her husband for the Italian early last year while he was making movies in India.

Miss Bergman, 40, and Rossellini, 51, were married by proxy in Mexico May 24, 1950, three months after her Mexican divorce from Lindstrom.

They have three children — Roberto Jr., who was born while the Swedish actress was still married to Lindstrom, and twin girls, Ingrid and Isabella. Miss Bergman also has an older daughter by Lindstrom.

Fireworks Blast May Cause Second Death

PORTLAND (AP) — The Multnomah County coroner will perform an autopsy to determine if there is any connection between the death of an elderly nursing home patient and Saturday's explosion of the Signal Fireworks Co. warehouse here.

The woman, Mrs. Annie Campbell, was a patient at the Warner nursing home which is located less than a block from the blast at 8325 S.E. Powell Blvd. She died shortly after 1 a.m. Tuesday. She suffered arm bruises in the blast and later complained of a pain in her stomach.

If the death is attributed to the explosion, it will raise the toll to two. Mary Beth Howe, 4, died in her home which was blasted and seared by the explosion.

Government Purchases Of Dairy Products Drop

WASHINGTON (AP) — Government purchases of surplus dairy products have dropped about 30 per cent since the price support level was reduced April 1.

Purchases during the April-June period this year totaled 142 million pounds compared with 201 million pounds in the corresponding period last year.

Purchases of butter were about the same, but quantities of cheese and dried milk dropped rather sharply.

One of the department's declared purposes in reducing the support level was to encourage more of the surplus to move into consumption and less into government hands.

County Lines Barred To Untested Cattle

SALEM (AP) — Cattle which haven't been tested for brucellosis can't be moved across county lines without permission from the state Department of Agriculture. This order was issued Thursday by Robert J. Steward, state director of agriculture.

Steward said the order is needed to enable the department to tell in which areas there is a mixture of tested and untested cattle.

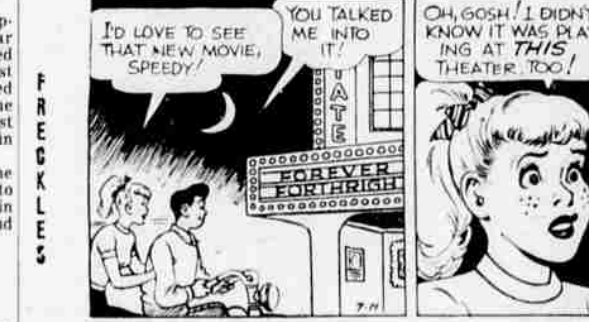
Noel is a Yoncalla High School graduate and is now employed with the Forest Service and stationed at Big Camas Ranger Station.
