TACOMA (AP) — Californians continued to dominate the seeded player ranks Wednesday as the Pacific Northwest tennis championships moved into its third day of action.

In Tuesday's second-round play, first-seeded Bill Rose of Portland easily downed Warren Hodgdon, Novato, Calif., 6-1, 6-0, in the men's singles while second-seeded Jim Watson of San Francisco eliminated Bob Denny of Tacoma, 6-1, 6-1.

Glen Bassett, third-seeded ace from Santa Monica, whipped Lou Surville, Vancouver, B.C., 7-5, 6-1. In the women's singles, first-ranked Farel Footman of San Francisco outstroked Sharon Whitaker, Victoria, B.C., 6-3, 6-3, and second-seeded Barbara Browning of Los Angeles defeated Tacoma's Sue Huff, 6-1, 6-1.

Portland Manager Hurts Back In Fall

SEASIDE, Ore. (AP) — Tommy Heath, manager of the Portland Beavers of the Pacific Coast League, suffered four vertebrae fracture in a tumble down a flight of stairs here Monday night.

Dr. Fred Rawls said that the 200-pound Heath was taken by ambulance to a Portland hospital after examination here. Heath suffered no injury to his spinal cord, Rawls said.

Heath was vacationing with his family at this ocean resort briefly prior to the start of a series with Seattle in Portland Tuesday night.

Rawls said Heath got up to go to the bathroom in his summer cottage, opened the wrong door, and tumbled down a short flight of stairs.

"He experiences considerable pain and probably will be in the hospital about two weeks. After that, he will have to wear a brace for a time," Rawls said.

Cougar Football Ticket Sales Head For Record

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — It's hardly the season to talk about football, but Washington State College reports that advance sales of tickets for the Cougars fall games are going at a record rate.

Ticket Manager Bob Smawley gave no specific figures Tuesday, but said orders were more than double what they were in 1957 in the first week of sales and were running well ahead of all previous years.

"So far, 65 per cent of all ticket orders are for the entire home schedule," he said.

Governor Holmes Protests Amendments To Indian Bill

SALEM (AP) — Gov. Robert D. Holmes protested Tuesday against "emasculating amendments" to the Klamath Indian timberland bill.

He made his protest in a telegram to speaker Sam Rayburn and Rep. Clair Engle (D-Calif.), chairman of the House Interior and Insular Affairs Committee.

The Senate passed the bill in May, but a House subcommittee proposed amendments that would result in quick depletion of the reservation forests, the governor said.

He urged the committee to leave the bill in the same form as passed by the Senate.

The telegram said: "On behalf of the state of Oregon, I wish to protest vigorously against amendments proposed to S. 3051. The amendment affecting sustained yield emasculates the fine original bill unanimously passed by the Senate."

"This amendment will result in flooding our markets with Indian timber and will rob Indians price-wise. It will adversely affect the whole economy of the Klamath Basin and will deplete and destroy one of America's finest stands of pine timber. Moreover, it will do untold harm to our watershed."

"In behalf of justice to our Indian citizens and for the cause of wise conservation of a tremendously rich resource, I urge restoration of sustained yield provisions provided in Senate version of S. 3051. In this time of grave international crisis when we should be thinking soberly of every resource we possess, the people of Oregon do not want Klamath timber disposed of on a fire-sale basis and neither, we suspect, do the great majority of the American people."

"As a conservationist and as governor of Oregon, I feel very strongly about this and plead with you to restore the bill to the original Senate form."

EUGENE (AP) — A logger was killed and nine others were injured when a crew transportation truck and a loaded logging truck collided head-on about 20 miles west of here Tuesday morning.
