

Family Allowance System Proposed

BUFFALO, N.Y. (AP) — A family allowance system in America to ease the financial strain on parents with many children is suggested by Roman Catholics.

In the closing session of their national family life convention Thursday, they asked the U. S. Congress to study the possibility of setting up such a program.

At present, a resolution said, "the rearing and education of children in an urban society continues to impose an inequitable burden on the parents of large families."

Church leaders noted that many European countries have family allowance plans — including predominantly Protestant Scandinavian countries. So does Canada on this continent.

Under the Canadian plan, parents get \$10 monthly for one child, and \$8 monthly for each additional child, from birth to the age of 18.

Former OSC Football Player With Marines

CORVALLIS (AP) — Vernon Ellison, Oregon State College graduate and guard on the OSC Rose Bowl football team of 1956, is believed to have landed in Lebanon with the 2d Battalion of the 2d Marine Division.

Ellison is a second lieutenant. He has been in the battalion for some time.

His parents are Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Ellison of Corvallis. His mother said she had no direct word, but presumed her son was with the battalion, which was the first to land in Lebanon.

Rocket Appeared Again Over Oregon Wednesday

PORTLAND (AP) — The rocket that put Russia's latest Sputnik into space passed over northwestern Oregon again Wednesday night.

Portlanders watched it arch across the sky at 8:55 p. m., brightening and dimming with reflected sunlight as it tumbled end over end.

Robert Boardwell of the Oregon Moonwatch team said the Smithsonian Institution has not yet relayed to him the schedule for Thursday night's passes.

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Heavy Construction Tie-Up Spreads To More Projects

PORTLAND (AP) — The tie-up of building and heavy construction jobs in Oregon spread to more big projects Thursday.

There was no indication when the Associated General Contractors and the operating engineers would resume negotiations in the dispute.

The contractors are now meeting with representatives of the Teamsters Union and a federal conciliator.

The AGC and Local 701 of the Hoisting and Portable Engineers met for three hours Tuesday and then adjourned without setting a date for another meeting.

Operations on the Oregon side of Brownlee and Oxbow dams, the Idaho Power Co. project on the Snake River, were shut down by Morrison-Knudsen Co. Thursday after engineers pickets appeared.

Ready To Continue

Morrison-Knudsen had said that it would not shut down under the AGC policy of "a strike against one is a strike against all" as long as employees kept coming to work.

Work on the Idaho side, where engineers from the Boise local of the engineers are employed, is continuing.

Also shut down Thursday was the Kingsley Field Air Force project at Klamath Falls, employing 100 men. Four contractors working on the 1½ million dollar job pulled their workmen off this morning when two engineers pickets appeared.

The engineers' contract with the AGC expired Jan. 1, and the teamsters' agreement expired June 1.

Previously big projects in Southwest Washington and in the Portland area were closed.

Spread Too Thin

Roy Smith, federal conciliator meeting with the contractors and the two unions, said the AGC-engineers talks were shut down because the contractors "couldn't negotiate in two places at once."

He said that some progress was made Thursday in AGC negotiations with the teamsters and an additional meeting was scheduled in the afternoon. No meetings have been scheduled with the engineers and the contractors, but Smith said one would be called soon.

RESORTS TO ROCKS

EUGENE (AP) — A Eugene policeman resorted to rock throwing early Thursday morning to stop a disturbance behind a residence.

The owner of the residence told the officer that he had heard a loud noise coming from behind the house and that it was keeping him awake.

Peace and quiet was restored when the officer threw a few rocks at four very large bullfrogs he found in a nearby slough.

100 BELIEVED DROWNED

CALCUTTA, India (AP) — About 100 persons were believed drowned when a launch capsized in a squall on the Rupnarayan River yesterday. The district magistrate in the area 40 miles from Calcutta said only 100 of the 200 passengers were rescued.

Large Amount Of Grain At Inspection Centers

SALEM (AP) — Grain moving into state inspection centers at Portland, Pendleton and Astoria totaled 82 million bushels in the fiscal year ended July 1, the state Agriculture Department reported Wednesday.

The total for the preceding fiscal year was a record of 106 million bushels.

Last year's shipments included: wheat, 51.6 million bushels; barley, 15.3 million; oats 3.2 million; corn, 2 million.

Of the total grain inspections, 73.7 million bushels were inspected at Portland, 7.2 millions at Astoria, and 1.1 millions at Pendleton.

MAY REPRODUCE TV

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Communications Commission says a station in The Dalles, Ore., may reproduce programs of television station KPTV in Portland.

The authorization was granted by the commission Wednesday to Mid-Columbia Community TV Corp., which operates a TV translator station on Channel 77.

Gale Force Winds Uproot Big Tree; 2 Persons Killed

GRANGEVILLE, Idaho (AP) — Gale-force winds uprooted a big fir tree and sent it crashing onto a small house trailer near here Thursday night, killing a mother and her 4-year-old daughter.

They were Mrs. Jeannette Hoogland, 23, and her daughter Katherine.

The woman's husband, James, a banker from Kamiah, Idaho, and a son, Steven, 3, suffered minor injuries when the tree smashed into the trailer at nearby campgrounds during a severe wind and lightning storm, which was accompanied by heavy rain.

The storm, with winds up to 40 m.p.h., raged over north central Idaho. It cut power lines and severed telephone communications here and at Lewiston for several hours. Pierce, Headquarters, Greer, Orofino and Troy also were affected.

Some streets and basements were reported flooded at Lewiston.

Man Mistakes His Wife For Prowler, Kills Her

DAYTON, Ohio (AP) — A suburban Kettering man, mistaking his wife for a prowler, shot her fatally early Friday, police reported.

They said Mrs. Ada Hayward, 58, died in Miami Valley Hospital at 5 a.m., about an hour and a half after being shot in the breezeway of her home.

Officers said the husband, Robert, 53, told them he was awakened by a noise in the breezeway and when he heard the noise a second time he got up and went with his .32 caliber revolver to investigate. In the breezeway, he said, he saw a figure moving near a doorway, and fired.

When he turned on the lights, he told police he saw it was his wife he had shot.

Detectives are investigating.

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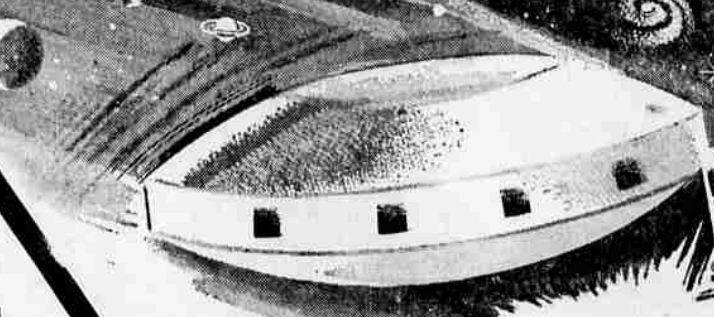
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
