TO HELP THE ROSEBURG CHAMBER OF COMMERCE publicize Roseburg during the next few months, the Richard Boss family will cross the United States and back during the summer months. THE FAMILY left Kansas July 7 bound for Montgomery, Ala., then to Atlanta, Raleigh, Washington D. C., New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Chicago. From Chicago Mrs. Boss and Rosemary and Bill will return with the car and trailer to Ada, Kansas, and Mr. Boss will go to Columbus, Ohio, to attend the national leadership conference at Ohio State University and later go to Buffalo, N. Y., to attend the AVA convention, after which he will fly to Ada to join his family and will return with them in the car and trailer to Roseburg Aug. 17.



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
