

### Jordan Requests Troops Of U. S.

AMMAN (AP) — King Hussein of Jordan declared Saturday night he has asked for and expects United States troops to come to Jordan and help him in a battle for survival against Syria and Egypt.

The young monarch told a news conference at Basman Palace he intends to do everything possible to restore the Arab Federation in the wake of the Iraqi revolt.

The federation consisted of Jordan and Iraq. The government of Iraq was overthrown by a coup Monday.

The king declined to elaborate on the sort of troops or help he seeks from the United States, but gave a strong indication he considers this help should be forthcoming since he has accused Egypt and Syria of being the agents of international communism.

### Oregon State Song Arranged For Concert

WASHINGTON (AP)—A special concert arrangement of the Oregon State Song will be a featured part of a coming program to honor Herman D. Kenin, new international president of the American Federation of Musicians.

Kenin claims Portland, where he headed the Musicians Union for 22 years, as his home town.

The concert arrangement of the song, Land of the Empire Builders, will be premiered by a 50-piece American Federation of Musicians symphonic orchestra.

Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore) who recently distributed copies of the state song to various musicians in the capital area, said the AFM presentation July 23 would be broadcast nationally with commentary by Kenin and other Oregonians.

Members of the capital's Oregon State Society have been invited to the program.

### Alaska Delegate Bartlett Withdraws From GOP Race

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) — Alaska Delegate E. L. Bartlett Saturday withdrew the gantlet he had flung down to Republican Gov. Mike Stepovich and said he would file for the U. S. Senate "with no strings attached."

Bartlett, non-voting delegate for 14 years, made his statement on the first day the filings for public office could be made for elections that will carry Alaska from territorial status to admission as the 49th state. The filing deadline is July 28.

Stepovich has remained silent on his political intentions but is expected to file for governor rather than the U. S. Senate as some Republican leaders have urged.

Two Democrats announced their candidacy today for governor — William A. Egan, Valdez businessman who has been a provisional U. S. senator for the territory for two years, and Victor A. Rivers of Anchorage, president of the Alaska Senate.

It appeared there may be no major Republican filings until Stepovich announces his plans.

### Wild West Show 'Broke'; Cupid's Plan Survives

WILD WEST SHOW — 18 BRUSSELS. (AP)—The attempt to bring a Wild West show and a rodeo to Brussels in connection with the World Fair resulted in a financial disaster and a scheduled wedding.

The rodeo company backing the show was declared bankrupt this weekend by a Belgian judge. It went broke after a long run of bad luck.

But meanwhile the show star, former U.S. rodeo champion Casey Tibbs, Los Angeles, made plans to get married here, after having vainly tried to rescue the show and start it all over again.

Casey announced his wedding plans Sunday night. He said "we decided to make the best of a disastrous situation."

The bride is Miss Cleo Ann Harrington of Colman, S.D., a brunette who was Miss Dakota in 1954. She came along with the show.

"Cleo and I," said Casey, "met four years ago and got engaged about two years ago."

Sioux Indians and most of the cowboys and cowgirls who were brought here for the rodeo show have now returned home or are on their way back.

The show opened here June 18. It closed July 13. It then broke down before the opening. The show had to be held in the open air and suffered from bad weather.
