

**65 Hogs Perish When Fire Destroys Buildings**

BANKS, Ore. (AP)—Some 65 hogs perished Friday night when fire destroyed several buildings on the Ray Van Domelin farm near here.

Firemen from Forest Grove, Hillsboro and Banks fought the flames after they broke out from an undetermined cause late in the night.

Fire destroyed the hogs and their pen, a barn full of hay, a granary that was partly full and a new milkshed.

Firemen managed to keep the blaze from reaching the Domelin house.
