Phoenix also lost, dropping a 7-0 decision to Sacramento, and that allowed Vancouver to increase its Pacific Coast League lead to 1 1/2 games as Vancouver downed Spokane, 4-1.

Brown Named July's Top Ringmaster; Folley Cited

NEW YORK (AP) — Lightweight champion Joe Brown of New Orleans has been named "Fighter of the Month" for July by Ring Magazine which also moved Zora Folley of Chandler, Ariz., into position as the No. 1 heavyweight contender.

Brown's winning effort against Kenny Lane of Muskegon, Mich., in his Houston title defense was cited in honoring the champion. Lane remained in No. 2 position behind Italy's Duilio Lo.

Folley had been bracketed in a tie with Eddie Machen of Redding, Calif., as co-holders of the No. 1 challenge position to heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson. After Folley's quick knockout of amateurish Pete Rademacher in Los Angeles last week, Folley was ranked as the top contender.

Machen was placed second. Roy Harris, the Cut and Shoot, Tex., challenger who boxes Patterson for the title in Los Angeles, Aug. 18, was listed as No. 5.

PCC Demise May Be Completed Soon

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The Pacific Coast Conference may be finally finished off at a mid-August meeting in Portland, Ore., KCBS sportscaster Don Klein declared Tuesday night.

He said Stanford, Oregon, Oregon State, Washington State and Idaho will meet to consider the future — or lack of it — of the PCC. California, UCLA, USC and Washington already have announced withdrawal plans.

Oregon and Oregon State have agreed to act together, remaining in the conference or withdrawing if Stanford does.

Klein said Stanford, wanting to meet its football commitments through 1962 in the PCC, may decide it has little choice but to join departing California, UCLA, USC and Washington. That would mark the end of the conference.
