

Greek Cypriots Offer Cease-Fire

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — The Greek underground EOKA waited today to see whether Turkish Cypriots and British officials would accept its offer to halt violence on this strife-ridden Mediterranean island.

Col. George Grivas, EOKA leader, announced in leaflets that he had ordered attacks on Britons and Turks stopped in an effort to end

communal violence which has cost more than 100 lives since June 7. But Grivas warned: "If provocations by British and Turks continue in any way... I shall be free to order immediate operations against both of them."

Turkish Cypriot leader Fazil Kutchuk welcomed Grivas' statement and said Turks would "have no reason to take any action for self-defense" if EOKA attacks stop.

There was no official comment from the British.

WHEAT SUPPLY UP

CHICAGO (AP) — The Board of Trade reported this week that the visible supply of wheat in the United States increased 14,607,000 bushels last week to 362,852,000 bushels.

Corn decreased 1,737,000 bushels to 79,402,000, oats increased 3,143,000 to 10,067,000, rye increased 474,000 to 4,313,000, barley increased 174,000 to 13,876,000, and soybeans decreased 1,078,000 to 6,434,000.

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
