OMAK, Wash. (AP) — Oliver W. Brown, 32, a Great Northern Railway Co. brakeman, fell from a boxcar, was run over and killed 10 miles south of here Tuesday.

Brown, who lived at Newman Lake in Spokane County, was helping switch cars on a siding when the accident happened. One of his legs was severed and he apparently died from loss of blood.
