Roy Markson Training Officer For Institution

SALEM (AP)—Roy L. Markson has been named training officer of the new Oregon state correctional institution now under construction here.

P. J. Squier, superintendent of the institution, said Thursday Markson will take part in preparing and leading the six-month program which will be given new employees in correctional work.

Markson previously was training officer at Monroe, Wash., reformatory where he initiated the indoctrination training course for new employees and in-service training for career employees.

The new correctional institution is to open March 1.

West Coast States Show June Employment Gains

SEATTLE (AP)—Washington, Oregon and California showed more than seasonal employment gains in June, the Labor Department said Thursday. Total employment for the three states that month was listed at 5,700,000, up 97,800 from May and 30,000 over normal seasonal expansion.

Oregon had the largest percentage increase with 4.3. Washington employment was up 2.8 per cent and California 1.3.

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FBI Agents Arrest Man Wanted On Murder Count

PORTLAND (AP)—FBI agents arrested Robert Dennis McCarthy, 38, this week and charged him with unlawful flight to avoid prosecution for murder.

The FBI said McCarthy has been charged with murder in the death last May in Eureka, Calif.

McCarthy, a one-time logger, was picked up without incident as he worked on a house painting job here.

He waived a preliminary hearing before U. S. Commissioner Claire Mundorff.

McCarthy had been sought since Aubrey Paul Morgan, 41, died May 31, four days after being beaten in a Eureka tavern.

Ex-President Truman Draws Laughs With Barb

CHICAGO (AP)—Former President Harry S. Truman, in a speech to the convention of the Fraternal Order of Eagles this week, drew a big laugh when he said:

"I've agreed to run for president when I'm 90 years old and, believe it or not, some damn fool found out that when I'm 90, it'll be an off year and I can't run then."

As to who the Democrats will nominate for the presidency in 1960, Truman, who is 74, said: "We have a lot of good men."

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower signed a bill this week giving him much but not all of the authority he sought to streamline the nation's defenses and tighten control over the separate armed services.

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Hemingway Drops Suit Protesting Re-use Of Stories

NEW YORK (AP)—The publishers of Esquire Magazine say it will reprint one instead of three of Ernest Hemingway's Spanish Civil War short stories as a result of the author's objections.

Publisher Arnold Gingrich said here this week that Hemingway would withdraw his state Supreme Court action for an injunction to block reappearance of the three stories this fall in "The Esquire Anthology."

Gingrich said Hemingway consented last Monday through his agent to the republication of "The Butterfly and the Tank" without revision. The other two pieces, "The Denunciation" and "Night Before Battle"—will not be used, Gingrich said.

The New York Times Thursday quoted Hemingway as saying he was dropping the suit, and denying he was concerned about his Spanish Civil War stories because they might cause unfavorable reaction.

The three stories in question first appeared in Esquire in 1938 and 1939. Hemingway was a correspondent during the war between the Loyalists and the victorious forces of Generalissimo Franco. Some characters in the three stories speak in favor of the Loyalist cause, which was backed by Russia. Franco was favored by Mussolini and Hitler.

SALEM (AP)—Information concerning brucellosis testing of a Gilliam County rancher's cattle is sought in a circuit court suit filed in London this week.

The State Department of Agriculture filed the suit, saying a cow which John Murtha took to a Condon slaughterhouse June 26 proved to be a reactor on the official blood test for brucellosis.

The court is asked to require Murtha to furnish the department with the number and location of all cattle he owns or controls subject to brucellosis testing, and the number which can be made available for testing not later than Nov. 15.

The state's complaint declares it is concerned over protection to Murtha's own herd as well as others with which it may come in contact.

Information Sought On Testing Of Cattle

BEIRUT (AP)—A check for \$10 arrived from Bellevue, Wash., this week made out to a Lebanese baker.

"I hope this will help him get started again," wrote Mrs. L. R. Ruck, of Bellevue.

At the height of the Lebanese rebellion, a terrorist bomb wrecked the bakery shop of Elias Antour. He had invested his life savings in it. Antour kept the shop open, defying rebels' efforts to enforce an order for a general strike.

An Associated Press story used his case among others as examples of the "little guy who is getting it in the neck" in Lebanon. Antour was almost speechless when a reporter brought the letter and the check.

"I have more hope now," he said. "People are very kind."

Bombed-Out Lebanese Baker Receives Check

LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP)—Jazz trumpeter Ziggy Elman, reported missing by his wife, was located early today at a night club here.

"What's all this jazz that I'm missing?" he asked a newsman. "I've never played better in my life."

Elman, 44, was reported missing from his Van Nuys home early Wednesday by his wife Ruby. She said he left Monday night because of a family argument.
