Career Employees Scholarships Are Awarded To Two

SALEM (AP)—Robert E. Stevens, Dallas, and William Paul Holtsclaw, Forest Grove, have been selected as first recipients of University of Oregon fellowships for career employees of the state. They get a year of graduate

study in political and social science. The fellowships, provided by the Ford Foundation and the University of Oregon, total about \$4,000 each. The winners were selected by a five-man screening board from among many applicants. It is required they return to their departments for a period at least equal to that of the educational leave. The two men are also eligible to receive up to half their monthly salaries during the period of study.

Stevens, assistant purchasing

agent with the Department of Finance and Administration, will do graduate study in purchasing administration. Holtsclaw's study will be in forestry and natural resource administration. A graduate of Oregon State College, he is district forest warden at Forest Grove.

Woman Pleads Innocent To Count

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—Connie Nicholas was taken in a paddy wagon from a hospital to court Thursday to plead innocent to a charge of murdering her straying, married lover a week ago. Judge Virgil Norris bound her over to the Marion County grand jury on a newly filed murder affidavit in the 15-minute hearing.

The 46-year-old rejected divorcee's right arm was in a sling, her right eye was bandaged, and there was a scab on the right side of her upper lip. She had told police she suffered the injuries in a violent argument with drug executive Forrest Teel, 54, after he emerged from his new girl friend's apartment.

When a reporter asked her how she felt, she replied, "see my doctor."

"I've told you not to talk to anyone," snapped her lawyer, Frank A. Symmes.

The Forest Service said that probably was the work of some enterprising picker who tacked up his own sign to keep other pickers out of a particularly good area.

Physicist Sees Accord On A-Weapons Tests End

PORTLAND (AP)—International agreement to end nuclear weapons tests will be reached within six months, a noted physicist predicted here this week.

Dr. Linus Pauling, winner of a Nobel Prize and one of the leading critics of nuclear tests, addressed a capacity audience of 600 at the Portland State College student center.

"I really think we are moving toward an era when there will be no more wars," said Pauling, who was here on a speaking tour.

Girl Killed In Attempt To Crawl Beneath Train

LITTLEFIELD, Tex. (AP)—Another freight train blocked the crossing and the three girls started to crawl under it, as they often did, Josephine Rodriguez, 15, told officers this week.

Suddenly, she said, the air brakes hissed and the train lurched into motion. Dora Rodriguez, 13, Josephine's sister, was crushed to death. A wheel sliced off the left leg of Carolina Martinez, 11; below the knee. Josephine scrambled to safety.

Carolina was reported in satisfactory condition after surgery.

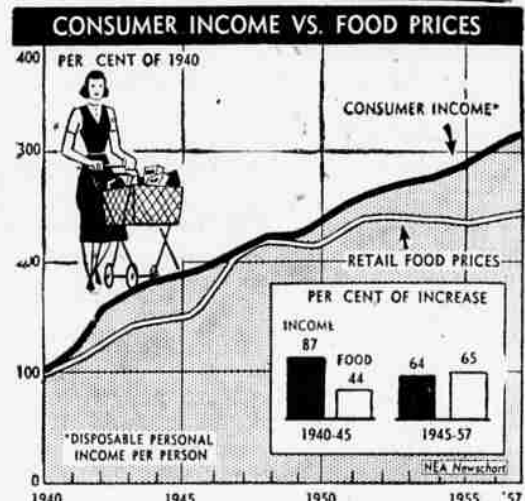

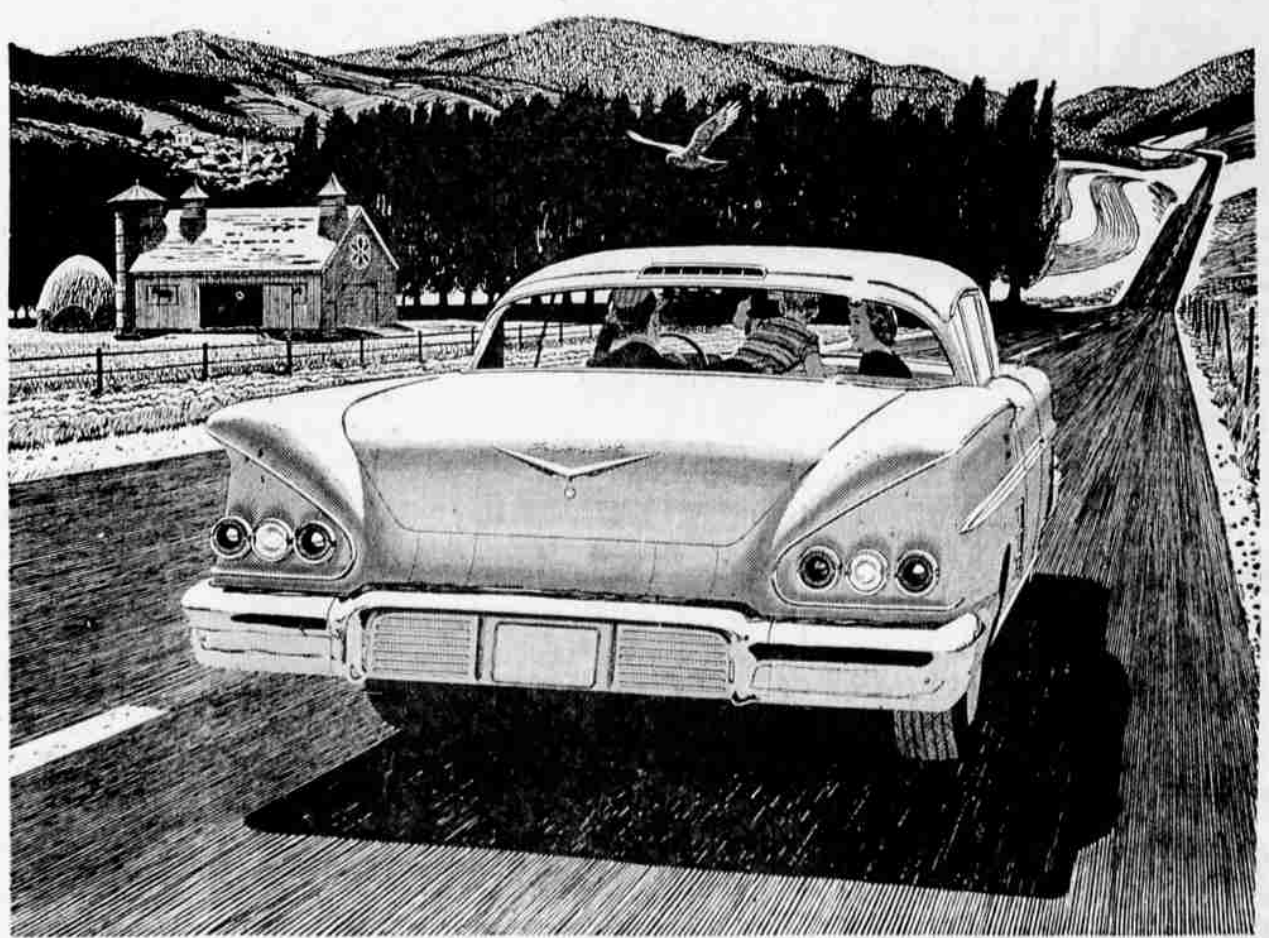
