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Destructive Tillamook Fire Recalled On Anniversary

SALEM (AP)—This is the 25th anniversary of a fire that started on Gales Creek in Northwestern Oregon and laid waste 300,000 acres.

The Gales Creek fire and other fires that followed in the same area killed 13½ billion board feet of timber.

Snags still stand, a quarter of a century later, grim reminders of the devastation in the Tillamook Burn.

The Gales Creek fire was fought by 3,000 men. It killed one Civilian Conservation Corps worker. It put ashes and cinders on streets in Pacific Coast cities so deep they could be shoveled up.

And it spelled the ultimate doom of most sawmills in Portland and on the Oregon side of the Lower Columbia River.

Costly Laboratory
It provided, too, a great but costly laboratory through which foresters have learned how best to rebuild a forest.

The Oregon State Board of Forestry, in a program without precedent, has directed the planting of 25 million trees on 31,000 acres, the aerial seeding of 57,336 acres, the felling of three quarters of a million snags and construction of 140 miles of fire break. Its reforestation work continues.

It was hot and dry on Aug. 14, 1933. A brisk east wind was blowing. The forests were tinder-dry, just as they have been in this rainless summer.

At 1 p. m. a logger snaked a huge Douglas fir log to a landing. Somehow, by friction of the log or from a line rubbing hotly along a stump or windfall, there was a spark.

Before loggers could get their

fire fighting tools, the spark had kindled a fire that leaped to the top of a tall snag. The east wind tossed burning debris a half mile into dry slashings.

Flame Spread Rapidly
A wall of flame pushed against the tall Douglas fir and soon the fire was racing through them with a roar that could be heard far into the valley.

A thousand Civilian Conservation Corps boys joined the men on the fire lines. After 10 days the fire had blackened 40,000 acres but it was nearly controlled.

Then on Aug. 24, lashed by an east wind, the fire exploded. In 20 hours it covered 257,000 acres and became one of the great fires of modern times.

Riddle Council Okays Ordinance On City Water

The Riddle City Council during its regular meeting approved an ordinance amendment which makes violation of the city's water department regulations a misdemeanor.

The new ordinance will enforce the regulations by authorizing disconnection of violators' water services and providing penalties for violations, said Correspondent Erma Best.

The city also announced its cash-on-hand figure as of June 30 was \$16,141, compared to a sum of \$14,930 on hand and in banks on the same date in 1957.

The figure was a result of an audit performed by B. K. Herndon & Co. The audit revealed that estimated value of city-owned buildings and facilities as of June 30 was more than \$233,000. Total indebtedness of the city stood at \$116,744, of which \$114,000 was due on outstanding bonds. The sum of \$15,907 was due the city for unpaid property taxes, fines and water bills.

In other action, the council opened three bids on a city fire truck to be purchased on a lease-rental agreement. Bids were submitted by Ronney's Inc., Portland; Western States Fire Apparatus Co., Cornelius; and American-LaFrance Corp., Beaverton. The contract will be awarded at a special meeting Aug. 28.

It was announced at the session that a mayor and three new council members will be elected during the November general election.

Bank Open Invitation, But Nothing Missing

SEATTLE (AP)—The door was ajar, light was on, windows open, fans going and \$8,300 was lying in an unlocked teller's drawer at a suburban bank.

Six years after that, in 1945, 173,000 acres burned again from a blaze starting on the Wilson River. It was fought by 4,000 men and it killed three of them. It also destroyed all remaining seed sources.

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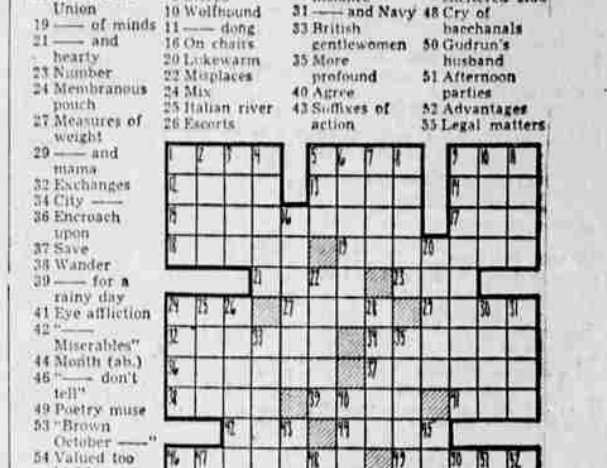
