Strange Sight Greets Roseburg Area Motorists

A strange sight came rumbling down Highway 99 Wednesday from Eugene, strange that is for highway travelers.

It was a 46-ton self-propelled gun on its way to the Douglas County Fair. Gov. Robert D. Holmes granted a special permit to move the enormous tank over the highway.

Marine Corps officials said they believe this is the first time a tank of this size has been driven over the highway in the western part of the United States. It is usually transported by railroad.

The machine was driven to Roseburg by S.Sgt. Harold Smith and

Sgt. Arthur West, members of the Second 155 Gun Battery, Marine Corps Reserve unit at Eugene. It took them four hours to make the trip.

The tank is 33 feet long, 13 feet high and 11 feet, 8 inches wide. It has an 810 horsepower motor and was first built in 1953. West and Smith will drive the machine back to Eugene Monday morning.

Cost of the tank is \$202,000. The Eugene reserve unit has two of them.

British Flaunt Fishing Boats In Iceland Waters

LONDON (AP) — A British fishing fleet of 100 boats sets sail this week to challenge Iceland's ban on foreign fishing within 12 miles of its shores. The Royal Navy is sending gunboats to protect them.

Iceland's fishing ban goes into effect Sept. 1 and its government has said any incursion of the banned area would be regarded as an attack on Iceland, a NATO ally.

Britain and other European countries charge that Iceland's order is an infringement of freedom on the high seas.

Keel Of Atomic Powered Scorpion Laid Wednesday

GROTON, Conn. (AP) — The keel for the Scorpion, an atomic-powered attack submarine, was laid Wednesday on the building ways in the south yards of the General Dynamics Corp. Electric Boat Division.

The ways were vacated Tuesday when the nuclear-powered Triton, the world's mightiest submarine, slid into the Thames River.

Commission of the 252-foot long Scorpion is scheduled in 1960.

Six Servicemen Die In Headon Highway Crash

FLORENCE, Tex. (AP) — Two autos collided headon with terrific impact on a winding road just north of this central Texas town Wednesday night, killing six servicemen.

Four were members of a reserve unit taking summer training at Ft. Hood, and the others were regular Army men stationed at Ft. Hood.

Both autos were demolished. Everyone in both cars died.

The four reservists were identified:

Sgt. James Cobb, 26, next of kin his wife, Patricia Ann, of Monroe, La.

Sgt. Lacey Stinson, 25, next of kin his wife, Mary M., of Dallas, Tex.

Cpl. John Manley, 21, next of kin his wife, Sandra Kay, of Monroe, La.

Cpl. Machiell Nasser, 22, next of kin his mother, Lilly M., of Shreveport, La.

The two regular Army men from Ft. Hood, riding in the other car and killed, were identified as:

Sgt. Leonard Zimmerman, 26, next of kin his mother, Emily, of San Antonio, Tex.

Sgt. Thomas E. Storms, 25, next of kin his wife, of Killeen, Tex.

The crash occurred on a farm road.

The post office building, overseas communications center for Lebanon, was closed about three hours. The terrorists obviously had to be lucky to get away with the bomb planting.
